A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The judiciary operates the Hawaii's Opportunity 2 Probation with Enforcement (HOPE) program, which has been
- 3 effective in reducing recidivism in crime and substance abuse.
- 4 The HOPE program is an intensive supervisory program that
- 5 provides an environment of caring support coupled with swift,
- 6 certain, consistent, and proportionate consequences for
- 7 misbehavior.
- 8 Homeless participants in the HOPE program are additionally
- 9 challenged by the inherent issues of living without the benefit
- 10 of a secure and stable home base. Further complicating the
- 11 plight of the homeless is substance abuse, which occurs among
- 12 the homeless populations in significantly higher numbers than
- 13 the general population.
- 14 HOPE program participants who are afflicted with
- 15 homelessness and substance abuse need a higher level of
- 16 assistance to successfully complete the program. HOPE provides

- 1 this assistance through a variety of services, including high
- 2 intensity drug rehabilitation programs.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to make an appropriation to
- 4 retain mental health counseling and drug dependence treatment
- 5 for homeless participants in the judiciary's HOPE program.
- 6 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the
- 9 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 10 2018-2019 to retain mental health counseling and substance abuse
- 11 treatment for participants of the judiciary's HOPE program.
- 12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the judiciary
- 13 for the purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
