

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BUSINESS PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 201-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§201-2 General objective, functions, and duties of
- 4 department. It shall be the objective of the department of
- 5 business, economic development, and tourism to make broad policy
- 6 determinations with respect to economic development and business
- 7 protection in the State and to stimulate through research and
- 8 demonstration projects those industrial and economic development
- 9 efforts that offer the most immediate promise of expanding the
- 10 economy of the State. The department shall endeavor to gain an
- 11 understanding of those functions and activities of other
- 12 governmental agencies and of private agencies that relate to the
- 13 field of economic development [-] and business protection. It
- 14 shall, at all times, encourage initiative and creative thinking
- 15 in harmony with the objectives of the department.
- 16 The department of business, economic development, and
- 17 tourism shall have sole jurisdiction over the land use

- 1 commission under chapter 205, state planning under chapter 225M,
- 2 and the Hawaii State Planning Act under chapter 226. Due to the
- 3 inherently interdependent functions of development, planning,
- 4 and land use, these functions shall not be transferred by
- 5 executive order, directive, or memorandum, to any other
- 6 department, nor shall these functions be subject to review or
- 7 approval by any other department."
- 8 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
