# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The department of business, economic
3	development, and tourism is authorized to establish and fill one
4	permanent state public-private partnership coordinator position,
5	exempt from chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to be placed
6	under the director of business, economic development, and
7	tourism to manage all public-private partnerships entered into
8	by the State and manage all contracts, proposals, and
9	negotiations associated with the State's public-private
10	partnerships. Public-private partnerships entered into by the
11	Hawaii public housing authority are exempt from this part.
12	PART II
13	SECTION 2. Chapter 201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
15	to read as follows:

11		(B)	Potential public-private projects that meet the
12			office's objectives and goals;
13		(C)	The necessary finances to establish and maintain
14			the office; and
15		(D)	The necessary finances to develop, implement, and
16			maintain the potential public-private projects;
17	(2)	Cooi	rdinate collaboration among state agencies to
18		ana	lyze and develop public-private partnership
19		pro	jects based on the needs and goals of the agency
20		and	State, including proposed economic benefits,

1		financial outcomes, contract terms and conditions, and
2		social benefits;
3	(3)	Create and maintain an analysis report for each
4		public-private partnership project that shall include:
5		(A) Proposed economic benefits;
6		(B) Potential financial outcomes;
7		(C) Contract terms and conditions; and
8		(D) Social benefits;
9	(4)	Develop and analyze plans for future public-private
10		partnership projects, including objectives and
11		criteria to measure the accomplishment of objectives,
12		develop and implement programs through which the
13		objectives are to be attained, and determine financial
14		requirements for public resources based on the needs
15		and goals of the State;
16	(5)	Assist those departments having interests in public-
17		private partnerships, coordinate those activities
18		which involve the responsibilities of multiple state
19		agencies, and encourage the timely and effective
20		implementation and completion of project milestones
21		and objectives;

1	(6)	Develop programs to continuously encourage public-
2		private partnership projects that will result in the
3		development of improved infrastructure and government
4		services in Hawaii;
5	(7)	Formulate and assist state agencies in formulating
6		specific program and project proposals to solicit
7		public-private partnerships;
8	(8)	In collaboration with agencies and private businesses,
9		oversee and implement each public-private partnership
10		project; and
11	(9)	Initiate Aloha Stadium redevelopment as its initial
12		public-private partnership project."
13		PART III
14	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
16	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
17	the same	sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
18	year 2018	-2019 to:
19	(1)	Establish and fill the state public-private
20		partnership coordinator position pursuant to part I of
21		this Act; provided that the position may be added to

1	the position count for the department of business,
2	economic development, and tourism; and
3	(2) Establish and operate the office of public-private
4	partnership and initiate Aloha Stadium redevelopment
5	pursuant to part II of this Act.
6	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
7	of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes
8	of this Act.
9	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2038.

#### Report Title:

Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; Public-private Partnership Coordinator Position; Office of Public-private Partnership; Appropriation

### Description:

Authorizes establishment of a State Public-Private Partnership Coordinator position within the department of business, economic development, and tourism to manage public-private partnerships entered into by the State and associated contracts, proposals, and negotiations, except public-private partnerships entered into by Hawaii public housing authority. Establishes an office of public-private partnership within the department of business, economic development, and tourism. Requires that the office create a strategic plan; create collaboration amongst state agencies to assist, identify, propose, plan, develop, and implement public-private projects; and oversee and implement the public-private projects. Appropriates funds to establish and fill the state public-private partnership coordinator position, establish and operate the office of public-private partnership, and initiate Aloha Stadium redevelopment.
