A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE SMALL BUSINESS REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 201M-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

If the proposed rules affect small business, the "(b) 3 agency shall consider creative, innovative, or flexible methods 4 of compliance for small businesses and prepare a small business 5 impact statement to be submitted with the proposed rules to the 6 departmental advisory committee on small business and the board 7 when the rules are essentially complete [and before the rules 8 are submitted to the governor for approval for public hearing.] 9 and ready to be filed with the lieutenant governor pursuant to 10 section 91-4. The statement shall provide a reasonable 11 determination of the following: 12 The businesses that will be directly affected by, bear 13 (1)

14 the costs of, or directly benefit from the proposed 15 rules;



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Description of the small businesses that will be (2)1 required to comply with the proposed rules and how 2 they may be adversely affected; 3 In dollar amounts, the increase in the level of direct 4 (3) costs such as fees or fines, and indirect costs such 5 as reporting, recordkeeping, equipment, construction, 6 labor, professional services, revenue loss, or other 7 costs associated with compliance; 8 The probable monetary costs and benefits to the 9 (4) implementing agency and other agencies directly 10 affected, including the estimated total amount the 11 agency expects to collect from any additionally 12 imposed fees and the manner in which the moneys will 13 be used; 14 The methods the agency considered or used to reduce 15 (5) the impact on small business such as consolidation, 16 simplification, differing compliance or reporting 17 requirements, less stringent deadlines, modification 18 19 of the fines schedule, performance rather than design standards, exemption, or any other mitigating 20 techniques; 21



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1	(6) How the agency involved small business in the
2	development of the proposed rules; and
3	(7) Whether the proposed rules include provisions that are
4	more stringent than those mandated by any comparable
5	or related federal, state, or county standards, with
6	an explanation of the reason for imposing the more
7	stringent standard."
8	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
9	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
