A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VISION ZERO.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that vision zero programs
- 2 are traffic safety programs that are based on the belief that
- 3 death and injury on roadways are preventable and seek to end
- 4 traffic deaths and serious injuries.
- 5 The legislature further finds that the idea originated in
- 6 Sweden, which adopted Vision Zero as a national policy in 1997
- 7 and by 2013 had achieved a record low of road accident
- ${f 8}$ fatalities. In 2000, the state of Washington became the first
- ${f 9}$ state in the United States to adopt a vision zero program and
- $10\,$ set an aggressive goal of zero traffic deaths and serious
- 11 injuries by 2030. Washington reported that the state averaged
- 12 twenty-two fewer traffic fatalities and eighty fewer serious
- 13 injuries each year from 2002 through 2011 and that its national
- 14 traffic fatality ranking has been lowered from eleventh in 2005
- 15 to fourth in 2010. Many of the country's large cities,
- 16 including New York City, Boston, Los Angeles, and Chicago, have
- 17 adopted vision zero type programs. The Federal Highway

- 1 Administration is also committed to the vision of eliminating
- 2 fatalities and serious injuries on our nation's roadways under
- 3 an approach termed "Toward Zero Deaths."
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 5 transportation to adopt and implement a vision zero program.
- 6 Section 2. (a) The department of transportation shall
- 7 implement a vison zero program by July 1, 2018.
- 8 (b) The goal of the vision zero program shall be to
- 9 eliminate traffic fatalities and serious injuries in the State
- 10 by 2030.
- 11 (c) The department of transportation, in conjunction with
- 12 the counties, shall take necessary steps to implement the
- 13 program.
- 14 (d) The director of transportation may adopt rules,
- 15 pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, necessary for
- 16 the purposes of this Act.
- 17 (e) No later than twenty days prior to the convening of
- 18 each regular session, the department shall submit a report to
- 19 the legislature on the progress made toward the goal of
- 20 eliminating traffic fatalities and serious injuries.
