### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LOCAL GOVERNMENT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 237D-6.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 3 "(b) Revenues collected under this chapter shall be 4 distributed in the following priority, with the excess revenues 5 to be deposited into the general fund: 6 (1)\$1,500,000 shall be allocated to the Turtle Bay conservation easement special fund beginning July 1, 7 8 2015, for the reimbursement to the state general fund 9 of debt service on reimbursable general obligation 10 bonds, including ongoing expenses related to the 11 issuance of the bonds, the proceeds of which were used 12 to acquire the conservation easement and other real 13 property interests in Turtle Bay, Oahu, for the 14 protection, preservation, and enhancement of natural 15 resources important to the State, until the bonds are 16 fully amortized;

4	(3)	\$82,000,000 shall be allocated to the tourism special									
5		fund established under section 201B-11; provided that:

9		implementation of initiatives to take advantage									
10		of expanded visa programs and increased travel

3		(C) Of the revenues remaining in the tourism special
4		fund after revenues have been deposited as
5		provided in this paragraph and except for any sum
6		authorized by the legislature for expenditure
7		from revenues subject to this paragraph,
8		beginning July 1, 2007, funds shall be deposited
9		into the tourism emergency special fund,
10		established in section 201B-10, in a manner
11		sufficient to maintain a fund balance of
12		\$5,000,000 in the tourism emergency special fund;
13	(4)	\$103,000,000 for fiscal year 2014-2015, \$103,000,000
14		for fiscal year 2015-2016, \$103,000,000 for fiscal
15		year 2016-2017, and [ <del>\$93,000,000</del> ] for each
16		fiscal year thereafter shall be allocated as follows:
17		Kauai county shall receive [ <del>14.5</del> ] per cent,
18		Hawaii county shall receive [ <del>18.6</del> ] per cent, <u>the</u>
19		city and county of Honolulu shall receive [44.1]
20		per cent, and Maui county shall receive [ <del>22.8</del> ]
21		per cent; provided that commencing with fiscal year



1 2018-2019, a sum that represents the difference 2 between a county public employer's annual required 3 contribution for the separate trust fund established 4 under section 87A-42 and the amount of the county 5 public employer's contributions into that trust fund 6 shall be retained by the state director of finance and 7 deposited to the credit of the county public 8 employer's annual required contribution into that 9 trust fund in each fiscal year, as provided in section 10 87A-42, if the respective county fails to remit the 11 total amount of the county's required annual contributions, as required under section 87A-43; and 12 13 (5) \$3,000,000 shall be allocated to the special land and 14 development fund established under section 171-19; 15 provided that the allocation shall be expended in 16 accordance with the Hawaii tourism authority strategic 17 plan for: 18 The protection, preservation, maintenance, and (A) 19 enhancement of natural resources, including

beaches, important to the visitor industry;

6 All transient accommodations taxes shall be paid into the 7 state treasury each month within ten days after collection and 8 shall be kept by the state director of finance in special 9 accounts for distribution as provided in this subsection.

10 As used in this subsection, "fiscal year" means the twelve-11 month period beginning on July 1 of a calendar year and ending 12 on June 30 of the following calendar year."

13 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2117.
