A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSISTENCE FISHING AREAS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it has been more
- 2 than two decades since the department of land and natural
- 3 resources was given the statutory authority under Act 271,
- 4 Session Laws of Hawaii 1994, to establish community-based
- 5 subsistence fishing areas by rule. Since that time, the
- 6 department has adopted rules for only one such area, Ha'ena
- 7 community-based subsistence fishing area, and only after being
- 8 specifically required to do so pursuant to Act 241, Session Laws
- 9 of Hawaii 2006. The department did not adopt rules for the
- 10 Ha'ena community-based subsistence fishing area until ten years
- 11 after its establishment by the legislature.
- 12 The legislature finds that the statutory process for
- 13 designation of and rulemaking for community-based subsistence
- 14 fishing areas provides a unique opportunity for local
- 15 communities to participate in the management of natural
- 16 resources for the benefit of the local community, the State, and
- 17 the environment as a whole. This process, created under Act 271

- 1 and codified as section 188-22.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 2 relies on collaboration between the department and grassroots
- 3 community organizations to designate and develop resource
- 4 management policies for special fisheries management areas.
- 5 Both the process for area designation and the rules for resource
- 6 management are designed to reaffirm and protect fishing
- 7 practices customarily and traditionally exercised for purposes
- 8 of native Hawaiian subsistence and culture.
- 9 The legislature further finds that near-shore-based fishing
- 10 practices need to be supported to ensure that the State
- 11 maintains a sustainable ecosystem that provides food and
- 12 resources to the State.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 14 land and natural resources to adopt rules within two years of
- 15 receiving a proposal for a community-based subsistence fishing
- 16 area.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 188-22.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- "[+]\$188-22.6[+] Designation of community-based
- 20 subsistence fishing area. (a) The department of land and
- 21 natural resources may designate community-based subsistence

2	specific activities to be conducted in the fishing		
3	area, evaluation and monitoring processes, methods of		
4	funding and enforcement, and other information		
5	necessary to advance the proposal.		
6	Proposals shall meet community-based subsistence needs and		
7	judicious fishery conservation and management practices. The		
8	department shall adopt rules pursuant to subsection (a) no later		
9	than two years from the date of receipt of a proposal. If the		
10	department fails to adopt rules within the required time, the		
11	department shall include that fact, including an explanation of		
12	why rules could not be timely adopted, in the annual report		
13	required under subsection (d).		
14	(c) For the purposes of this section:		
15	$\left[\frac{1}{1}\right]$ "Native Hawaiian" means any descendant of the races		
16	inhabiting the Hawaiian Islands prior to 1778[; and].		
17	$\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ "Subsistence" means the customary and traditional		
18	native Hawaiian uses of renewable ocean resources for direct		
19	personal or family consumption or sharing.		
20	(d) The department of land and natural resources shall		
21	submit an annual report to the legislature of the department's		

- 1 progress in complying with this section no later than twenty
- 2 days prior to the convening of each regular session, beginning
- 3 with the regular session of 2018."
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 6 begun before its effective date.
- 7 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2030.
