A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I	
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there are nearly ten	
3	thousand pesticides registered for use in Hawaii. The	
4	department of agriculture is responsible for ensuring pesticides	
5	are used correctly in Hawaii. The legislature further finds	
6	that it is in the interest of the public to enhance the ability	
7	of the department of agriculture and the University of Hawaii	
8	college of tropical agriculture and human resources to respond	
9	to questions about pesticide use and make recommendations	
10	regarding pesticides for the protection of public safety and the	
11	environment. The legislature concludes that this can best be	
12	accomplished by increasing the pesticide licensing fee and	
13	amending the authorized uses of the pesticide use revolving	
14	fund.	
15	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:	
16	(1) Increase the pesticide licensing fee and require	
17	annual renewal of the license;	

1	(2)	Amend authorized uses for moneys in the pesticide use
2		revolving fund;
3	(3)	Require a memorandum of understanding between the
4		department of agriculture and the University of Hawaii
5		college of tropical agriculture and human resources
6		regarding the expenditure of funds from the pesticide
7		use revolving fund and a report to the legislature;
8	(4)	Establish an environmental toxicologist position
9		within the department of agriculture and a pesticide
10		extension specialist, through a contract with the
11		department of agriculture, within the University of
12		Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human
13		resources; and
14	(5)	Appropriate funds out of the pesticide use revolving
15		fund for specific purposes.
16		PART II
17	SECT	ION 2. Section 149A-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended by	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
19	" (b)	The licensee shall pay $[\$75]$ $\$310$ for each year, or
20	fraction	thereof, that the pesticide is licensed. Licensing
21	fees may 1	be increased or decreased from time to time by rules

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- 1 and may vary according to the amount or quantity of pesticide to
- 2 be sold, offered for sale, or distributed. [The term of the
- 3 license shall be for a period of up to three years. A] Every
- 4 license shall expire on December 31 [of the third] each year.
- 5 In case of renewal of license, a statement shall be required
- 6 only with respect to information which is different from that
- 7 furnished when the pesticide was licensed or last relicensed."
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 149A-13.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 "§149A-13.5 Pesticide use revolving fund; [pesticide
- 11 training workshops;] uses; training fee. (a) There is
- 12 established within the treasury of the State, a pesticide use
- 13 revolving fund. The fund shall be administered by the
- 14 department for the purposes of this section. The fund shall
- 15 consist of:
- 16 (1) Licensing and registration fees and charges collected
- by the department under section 149A-13(b);
- 18 (2) All fees collected by the department through the
- 19 collection of training fees in accordance with
- 20 subsection (c); and

4	(b) [Moneys in the pesticide use revolving fund shall be
5	expended by the department to support the pesticide program's
6	registration and licensing, certification and education, and
7	compliance monitoring activities. The department shall also
8	expend revolving fund moneys on the establishment of pesticide
9	training workshops, educational programs, development of
10	integrated pest management strategies, the pesticide subsidy
11	program created under Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, and
12	other services for pesticide users such as the agricultural pest
13	control industry, the structural pest control industry, and
14	consumer users of pesticides, which provide pesticide

17 all other pesticide services deemed necessary by the
18 department.] Moneys from the pesticide use revolving fund may
19 be used for personnel, services, materials, and equipment for
20 the purposes of this section[; provided that the use of moneys

collection, disposal, and recycling of pesticide containers and

instruction in areas including but not limited to the

21 from the revolving fund for personnel costs shall be limited to

1	those emp	loyees under the registration and education section of
2	the depar	tment's pesticides branch]. Moneys in the revolving
3	fund shal	l be expended by the department for:
4	(1)	Registration and technical review;
5	(2)	Certification, including certification of restricted
6		use pesticides or experimental use pesticides;
7	(3)	Compliance monitoring activities;
8	(4)	Development of an electronic data collection system
9		for all required pesticide reporting;
10	(5)	Personnel costs, including the hiring of necessary
11		staff;
12	(6)	Development of pesticide-related educational materials
13		in conjunction with the University of Hawaii college
14		of tropical agriculture and human resources;
15	(7)	Demonstration trials in conjunction with the
16		University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture
17		and human resources cooperative extension service
18		agents to develop integrated management and drift
19		management technologies; and
20	(8)	A pesticide disposal program.

1	The department shall also expend revolving fund moneys on
2	the pesticide subsidy program created under Act 105, Session
3	Laws of Hawaii 2014, and shall partner with the University of
4	Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources to
5	expend revolving fund moneys on the establishment of pesticide
6	education programs and pesticide training programs and for the
7	establishment of a position of pesticide extension specialist.
8	[Moneys expended by the department from the pesticide use
9	revolving fund for training workshops, educational programs, and
10	other services for the agricultural pest control industry, the
11	structural pest control industry, and consumer groups shall be
12	expended in a manner that appropriately addresses the needs of
13	each category of pesticide user.]
14	(c) The department may set fees for [the] any educational
15	[services] programs and training programs provided under this
16	section.
17	(d) All interest earned on the deposit or investment of
18	the moneys in the fund shall become a part of the fund.
19	[(e) All unobligated, unencumbered, or unexpended funds
20	remaining in the fund in excess of \$250,000 at the close of each
21	fiscal year shall lapse to the state general fund.

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1	(£)]	(e) The department shall submit an annual report to
2	the legis	lature on all moneys deposited into, and disbursed
3	from, the	pesticide use revolving fund. The report shall be
4	submitted	to the legislature not fewer than twenty days prior to
5	the conve	ning of each regular session. The report shall
6	[group]:	
7	(1)	Group all moneys deposited into, and disbursed from,
8		the revolving fund according to the categories
9		established in subsections (a) to [(e).] <u>(d);</u>
10	(2)	Include recommendations to improve pesticide education
11		and regulatory processes within the State; and
12	(3)	Include recommendations for budget reallocations for
13		the subsequent fiscal year."
14		PART III
15	SECT	ION 4. (a) The department of agriculture and the
16	Universit	y of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human
17	resources	shall execute a memorandum of understanding regarding
18	the expen	diture of moneys from the pesticide use revolving fund
19	pursuant	to section 149A-13.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes.
20	(b)	No later than twenty days prior to the regular session
21	of 2018	and each regular session thereafter the department of

- 1 agriculture and University of Hawaii college of tropical
- 2 agriculture and human resources shall submit a report to the
- 3 legislature on all moneys expended from the pesticide use
- 4 revolving fund in accordance with the memorandum of
- 5 understanding required under subsection (a).
- 6 SECTION 5. (a) There is established within the department
- 7 of agriculture the position of an environmental toxicologist.
- 8 The position shall be exempt from chapter 76, Hawaii Revised
- 9 Statutes. The position shall partner with the department of
- 10 health toxicologist to expand the technical capacity of the
- 11 departments of agriculture and health to analyze findings and
- 12 make recommendations regarding environmental and human health.
- 13 (b) There shall be a memorandum of understanding between
- 14 the department of agriculture environmental toxicologist and the
- 15 department of health toxicologist that defines a collaborative
- 16 relationship between the two positions.
- 17 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 18 revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be
- 19 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for

- 1 operating expenses and the position of environmental
- 2 toxicologist established under section 5 of this Act.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 4 of agriculture exclusively for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 7. There is established within the University of
- 6 Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources the
- 7 position of pesticide extension specialist, to be funded by the
- 8 pesticide use revolving fund through a contract with the
- 9 department of agriculture. The pesticide extension specialist
- 10 shall be responsible for:
- 11 (1) Developing educational materials in conjunction with
- the department of agriculture pursuant to section
- 13 149A-13.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes;
- 14 (2) Working with the environmental toxicologist
- established under section 5 of this Act to design
- 16 experiments; and
- 17 (3) Exploring partnerships with other agencies for funding
- 18 opportunities.
- 19 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 20 revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be
- 21 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much

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- 1 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for
- 2 operating expenses and the position of a pesticide extension
- 3 specialist established under section 7 of this Act.
- 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 5 of agriculture exclusively for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 PART IV
- 7 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 8 revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be
- 9 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much
- 10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for
- 11 registration and technical review.
- 12 SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 13 revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be
- 14 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much
- 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for
- 16 certification activities, including certification of restricted
- 17 use pesticides or experimental use pesticides.
- 18 SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 19 revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be
- 20 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much

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- 1 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for
- 2 compliance monitoring expenses.
- 3 SECTION 12. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 4 revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be
- 5 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much
- 6 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
- 7 development of an electronic data collection system.
- 8 SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 9 revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be
- 10 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much
- 11 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
- 12 development of pesticide-related educational materials.
- 13 SECTION 14. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 14 revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be
- 15 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much
- 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to conduct
- 17 demonstration trials in conjunction with the University of
- 18 Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources
- 19 cooperative extension service agents to develop integrated
- 20 management and drift management technologies.

- 1 SECTION 15. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 2 revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be
- 3 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much
- 4 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
- 5 pesticide disposal program.
- 6 SECTION 16. The sums appropriated by sections 9 to 15
- 7 shall be expended by the department of agriculture exclusively
- 8 for the purposes of this part.
- 9 PART V
- 10 SECTION 17. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 18. This Act shall take effect on July 31, 2150.

Report Title:

Pesticides; Licensing; Fees; Pesticide Use Revolving Fund; Appropriation

Description:

Increases the pesticide licensing fee and requires annual renewal of the license. Amends authorized uses for moneys in the pesticide use revolving fund. Requires MOA between Department of Agriculture and UH regarding the expenditure of funds from the revolving fund and a report to the legislature. Establishes an environmental toxicologist position and a pesticide extension specialist position. Appropriates funds out of the revolving fund for specific purposes.

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
