A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FROZEN FOOD PRODUCT LABELING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that some vendors
- 2 circumvent the intent of the law applicable to the labeling of
- 3 previously frozen fish by displaying the information on the
- 4 label in such fine print that the information is not "easily
- 5 seen under customary conditions of purchase," as the law
- 6 requires. Specifying a minimum letter size for this labeling
- 7 requirement will prevent vendors from making this information
- 8 unclear or inconspicuous.
- 9 The purpose of this Act is to clarify labeling requirements
- 10 for the sale of frozen food products in general.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 328-62, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- "\$328-62 Description of label. "Label" means the
- 14 information required in this part to be placed on any food
- 15 products by means of a stamp, stencil, or printing by machine,
- 16 or by attaching to the immediate package, by sign, handbill,
- 17 placard, or otherwise, the words "PREVIOUSLY FROZEN" in letter

- 1 size [easily seen under customary conditions of purchase.] not
- 2 less than seventy-five per cent of the size of the font that is
- 3 used for the main text of the label."
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 6 begun before its effective date.
- 7 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
