HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP RECOMMENDATIONS TO INCREASE COLORECTAL CANCER SCREENING RATES IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of 1 cancer deaths for men and the third leading cause of cancer 2 3 deaths for women in the State; and 4 WHEREAS, approximately 660 Hawaii residents are diagnosed 5 with colorectal cancer every year, and nearly 240 Hawaii 6 residents die from the disease each year; and 7 8 WHEREAS, colorectal cancer has very few symptoms, making 9 screenings vital to detection and treatment of the cancer in its 10 11 early stages; and 12 WHEREAS, Hawaii currently has a screening rate of 70 13 percent, with a state goal of reaching an 80 percent screening 14 rate by 2020; and 15 16 WHEREAS, in 2016 the Hawaii Comprehensive Cancer Coalition 17 unveiled a five-year strategic plan to address early detection 18 of colorectal cancer through education, outreach, and working 19 with health systems and community partners; and 20 21 WHEREAS, with the uncertainty of the health insurance 22 market and federal funding for existing cancer screening and 23 prevention programs, it is prudent and reasonable for cancer 24 control advocates to come together as a community to reevaluate 25 these issues in the volatile healthcare landscape; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the Department of Health, American Cancer Society, 28 American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network, and other 29 community partners are all committed to reducing the burden of 30 31 colorectal cancer in Hawaii; now, therefore, 32



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BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 1 2 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2017, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Health is 3 4 requested to convene a working group, with the assistance of the 5 American Cancer Society-Hawaii-Pacific and the American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network, to develop recommendations to 6 7 increase colorectal cancer screening rates in the State; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to incorporate cancer control organizations including hospitals, 10 healthcare associations, community health centers, insurers, and 11 other interested public health groups; and 12 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that pursuant to the Hawaii State Cancer Plan 2016-2020, the working group is requested to examine 15 16 and identify specific actions to: 17 (1)Promote public education on colorectal cancer 18 screenings in combination with other screenings; 19 20 21 (2)Identify barriers to colorectal cancer screening among underserved, hard-to-reach population groups, and 22 develop effective strategies to overcome those 23 barriers; 24 25 26 (3) Increase public knowledge about family history as a risk factor for colorectal cancer; 27 28 29 (4) Implement small media interventions; 30 (5) Utilize provider-client reminder systems to ensure 31 timely compliance with screenings; 32 33 (6) 34 Partner with community clinics and federally qualified health centers to implement evidenced-based screening 35 interventions; and 36 37 38 (7) Partner with union organizations and employer groups 39 to provide cancer screening education to members of unions and employer groups; and 40 41

(1)	Existing and potential state and community resources to address screening and awareness of colorectal
	cancer;
(2)	The use of targeted models and methods to reach underserved populations within the State's unique social, cultural, and geographic diversity;
(3)	Strategies to partner across health systems, providers, insurers, and community organizations to collaborate on reaching underserved populations; and
(4)	Any other proposals that have the potential to increase colorectal cancer screening rates; and
 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to submit findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2018; and 	
 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health; American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network; and Executive Director of the American Cancer Society-Hawaii-Pacific.
