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leaving the majority of patients and their families to bear the 1 enormous burden of treatment costs, family stress, and loss; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, while metastatic breast cancer remains incurable, 5 there is reason to be hopeful as extensive research is underway and support and resources are available to patients and their 6 families through medical providers, in the community, and 7 8 online; and 9 10 WHEREAS, more research is still needed, particularly on the personal and social burdens of metastatic breast cancer, so that 11 12 new and more effective treatments may be developed; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the State will continue to support policies that make diagnosis, treatment, and support resources accessible to 15 all Hawaii residents; now, therefore, 16 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 19 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2017, the Senate concurring, that October 13, 2017, is 20 21 designated as Metastatic Breast Cancer Awareness Day; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 24 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Health, and the respective Mayors of the City and County of 25 Honolulu and the Counties of Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui. 26 27 28 29 Alla h OFFERED BY:



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
