## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO ASSESS THE SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL EFFECTS OF REQUIRING HEALTH INSURERS, MUTUAL BENEFIT SOCIETIES, AND HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATIONS TO PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR MEDICALLY NECESSARY COGNITIVE REHABILITATION THERAPY FOR SURVIVORS OF TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY.

WHEREAS, traumatic brain injury is damage to the brain, not 1 of a degenerative or congenital nature, that is caused by an 2 external force; and 3 4 WHEREAS, traumatic brain injury may produce a diminished or 5 altered state of consciousness and may result in an impairment 6 of cognitive abilities or physical functioning; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, traumatic brain injury is a leading cause of death and disability among children and young adults; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, survivors of traumatic brain injury can lead full lives thanks to lifesaving medical techniques and rehabilitation 13 services; however, survivors face a long rehabilitation process 14 that may not be covered by certain health benefit plans; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires that "[b]efore any legislative measure that mandates health 18 insurance coverage for specific health services, specific 19 diseases, or certain providers of health care services as part 20 of individual or group health insurance policies, can be 21 considered, there shall be concurrent resolutions passed 22 requesting the auditor to prepare and submit to the legislature 23 a report that assesses both the social and financial effects of 24 25 the proposed mandated coverage"; and 26 27 WHEREAS, section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, further provides that "[t]he concurrent resolutions shall designate a 28

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1 WHEREAS, since the Auditor's Report No. 04-11 was issued, a range of studies on the treatment of traumatic brain injuries 2 3 have been published; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the incidence of traumatic brain injury continues 6 to increase, particularly among veterans who have returned from 7 serving in combat missions overseas; and 8 WHEREAS, the Legislature believes that a follow up analysis 9 10 to Auditor's Report No. 04-11 is warranted; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Legislature also believes that mandatory coverage for medically necessary cognitive rehabilitation 13 14 therapy for survivors of traumatic brain injury, as provided in S.B. No. 225, S.D. 1, Regular Session of 2017, will 15 substantially reduce illness and help survivors of traumatic 16 17 brain injuries in this State lead full, productive lives; now, therefore, 18 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 21 of 2017, the Senate concurring, that the Auditor is requested to 22 conduct an assessment, pursuant to sections 23-51 and 23-52, 23 24 Hawaii Revised Statutes, of the social and financial effects of mandating health insurers, mutual benefit societies, and health 25 26 maintenance organizations to provide coverage for medically necessary cognitive rehabilitation therapy for survivors of 27 28 traumatic brain injury effective January 1, 2018, as provided in 29 S.B. No. 225, S.D. 1, Regular Session of 2017; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is also requested to consider the wide range of studies on the treatment of 32 33 traumatic brain injuries that have been published since Auditor's Report No. 04-11 was issued; and 34 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to submit its findings and recommendations to the Legislature, 37 including any necessary implementing legislation, no later than 38 39 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 40 2018; and 41

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 1 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor and the 2 Insurance Commissioner, who in turn is requested to transmit 3 copies to each insurer in the State that issues health insurance 4 5 policies, contracts, plans, or agreements. 6
