

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR THE CREATION OF A STRUCTURAL LICENSING BOARD.

1	WHEREAS, the Legislature believes that construction			
2	industry review boards, such as the Contractors License Board			
3	(CLB), are necessary to protect the welfare and safety of the			
4	general public; and			
5				
6	WHEREAS, the CLB has since created more than 80			
7	subcontractor license subcategories and is in charge of			
8	administering and issuing those construction licenses; and			
9				
10	WHEREAS, the Legislature has also established a special			
11	Board of Electricians and Plumbers, to reduce the amount of			
12	license requests the CLB has to review and administer; and			
13				
14	WHEREAS, the CLB is currently not set up to specifically			
15	address the specialized licensing needs and concerns that			
16 17	involve constructing specialized structures; and			
17 18	WUEPEAG a structural angineer must angure that the			
10 19	WHEREAS, a structural engineer must ensure that the			
19 20	subcontractors and workers assigned to install and erect specialized structures have sufficient knowledge and experience			
20 21	to ensure a safe work environment for the installation and			
21	construction using structural steel; and

24	WHEREAS, there are at least eight license classifications			
25	under the CLB, namely, C-6 carpentry framing, C-31 masonry, C-32			
26	ornamental, guardrail, and fencing, C-35 pile driving, pile and			
27	caisson drilling, and foundation, C-38 post tensioning, C-41			
28	reinforcing steel, C-48 structural steel, and C-56 welding,			
29	which should be regulated under a new specialized Structural			
30	Licensing Board that is responsive to the needs of this			
31	specialized type of work; and			



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WHEREAS, it is unreasonable to expect the CLB to be 1 2 knowledgeable in the specific requirements of installing and 3 constructing specialized structures; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that the public's health, safety, and welfare may be unduly put at risk without a 6 Structural Licensing Board; now, therefore, 7 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 10 of 2017, the Senate concurring, that the Auditor is requested to 11 conduct a feasibility study for the creation of a Structural 12 13 Licensing Board; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to include the following in its study: 16 17 A determination on the feasibility of creating a 18 (1) Structural Licensing Board; 19 20 An estimate of the number of individuals who may be (2) 21 granted a license by the proposed Structural Licensing 22 23 Board; 24 The amount of time currently spent on reviewing 25 (3) specialized license applicants and whether the 26 proposed Structural Licensing Board will reduce the 27 28 amount of time spent on reviewing and processing those applicants; 29 30 31 (4)An estimate of the cost for the creation of a Structural Licensing Board; 32 33 Suggested amendments or modifications to the practice 34 (5) of issuing C-6 carpentry framing, C-31 masonry, C-32 35 ornamental, quardrail, and fencing, C-35 pile driving, 36 pile and caisson drilling, and foundation, C-38 post 37 38 tensioning, C-41 reinforcing steel, C-48 structural steel, and C-56 welding licenses; 39 40

27 28 29	proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2018; and			
30 31 32	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor and Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs.
