## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR THE CREATION OF A STRUCTURAL LICENSING BOARD.

WHEREAS, the Legislature believes that construction 1 2 industry review boards, such as the Contractors License Board (CLB), are necessary to protect the welfare and safety of the 3 4 general public; and 5 WHEREAS, the CLB has since created more than 80 6 subcontractor license subcategories and is in charge of 7 8 administering and issuing those construction licenses; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Legislature has also established a special Board of Electricians and Plumbers, to reduce the amount of 11 license requests the CLB has to review and administer; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the CLB is currently not set up to specifically 14 address the specialized licensing needs and concerns that 15 involve constructing specialized structures; and 16 17 WHEREAS, a structural engineer must ensure that the 18 subcontractors and workers assigned to install and erect 19 specialized structures have sufficient knowledge and experience 20 21 to ensure a safe work environment for the installation and construction using structural steel; and 22 23 WHEREAS, there are at least eight license classifications 24 25 under the CLB, namely, C-6 carpentry framing, C-31 masonry, C-32 ornamental, guardrail, and fencing, C-35 pile driving, pile and 26 27 caisson drilling, and foundation, C-38 post tensioning, C-41 reinforcing steel, C-48 structural steel, and C-56 welding, 28 which should be regulated under a new specialized Structural 29 Licensing Board that is responsive to the needs of this 30 specialized type of work; and 31



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WHEREAS, it is unreasonable to expect the CLB to be 1 2 knowledgeable in the specific requirements of installing and constructing specialized structures; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that the public's health, 5 6 safety, and welfare may be unduly put at risk without a Structural Licensing Board; now, therefore, 7 8 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 9 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 10 of 2017, that the Auditor is requested to 11 conduct a feasibility study for the creation of a Structural 12 13 Licensing Board; and 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 15 16 include the following in its study: 17 A determination on the feasibility of creating a (1) 18 Structural Licensing Board; 19 20 21 (2) An estimate of the number of individuals who may be granted a license by the proposed Structural Licensing 22 Board; 23 24 25 (3) The amount of time currently spent on reviewing specialized license applicants and whether the 26 proposed Structural Licensing Board will reduce the 27 amount of time spent on reviewing and processing those 28 29 applicants; 30 An estimate of the cost for the creation of a 31 (4)Structural Licensing Board; 32 33 Suggested amendments or modifications to the practice (5) 34 35 of issuing C-6 carpentry framing, C-31 masonry, C-32 ornamental, guardrail, and fencing, C-35 pile driving, 36 pile and caisson drilling, and foundation, C-38 post 37 tensioning, C-41 reinforcing steel, C-48 structural 38 steel, and C-56 welding licenses; 39
