## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE AND COUNTIES TO UTILIZE METRIC MEASUREMENTS ALONGSIDE UNITED STATES CUSTOMARY MEASUREMENTS IN ALL PUBLIC SIGNAGE.

1 WHEREAS, the metric system is the language of science, medicine, international commerce, and most sports; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, the metric system is the most widely used system 5 of measurements in the world, having been officially adopted in all but three countries worldwide; and 6 7 WHEREAS, learning two measurement systems may be time-8 9 consuming and confusing; and 10 WHEREAS, it is easier to make conversions using the metric 11 system, requiring only the moving of the decimal point right or 12 left; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, unfamiliarity with the metric system can result in costly and dangerous conversion errors; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, it is easier to conceptualize one gram versus 1/28th of an ounce, or one milliliter versus 1/29th of a fluid 19 20 ounce; and 21 22 WHEREAS, use of the metric system is necessary for travel outside of the United States; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the economic benefits of global interoperability 25 greatly outweigh the challenges of converting to the metric 26 27 system; and 28 WHEREAS, product design, manufacturing, marketing, and 29 30 labeling are all made more difficult by having to convert measurements from one system of measurements to the other; and 31 32 WHEREAS, switching to the metric system would likely result 33 in the creation of many jobs and enable the current and future 34



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workforce of the United States to be better prepared to work in 1 2 the international economy; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the effectiveness of the metric system can be seen throughout the medical field, where its utilization has improved 5 services across the industry; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Institute for Safe Medication Practices' 2016-8 2017 Targeted Medication Safety Best Practices for Hospitals 9 10 report urges the use of liquid medication dosing devices that only display volume using the metric scale; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Institute for Safe Medication Practices has 13 received more than fifty reports of errors resulting from mix-14 ups between metric milliliters (ml) and other, non-metric 15 measurements such as drops or teaspoons; and 16 17 WHEREAS, some of these mistakes have led to injuries 18 19 requiring hospitalization; and 20 WHEREAS, greater familiarity with the metric system of 21 measurements may have helped prevent these and other types of 22 errors; now, therefore, 23 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 25 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 26 of 2017, that this body finds that continued familiarity with 27 and utilization of the metric system is beneficial; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all state and county agencies 30 are requested to include the metric system of measurements 31 alongside United States customary measurements in all public 32 33 signage expressing speed and distance in order to help the public gain familiarity with the metric system of measurement; 34 and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 37 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and to the Mayor and 38 Chairperson of the Council of each county, all of whom are, in 39 turn, requested to transmit copies to the head of each 40 department or agency, as the case may be, within their 41 respective jurisdictions. 42



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
