HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO STUDY THE EFFECTIVENESS OF SUICIDE PREVENTION TRAINING.

WHEREAS, suicide was the most common cause of fatal 1 injuries among Hawaii residents over the five-year period from 2 2010 to 2014, accounting for over one-quarter of all fatal 3 injuries; and 4 5 WHEREAS, suicide was the leading cause of injury-related 6 death for most age groups, except for the very young and the 7 very old, outpacing car crashes, homicide, unintentional 8 poisoning, and drowning; and 9 10 WHEREAS, one person dies by suicide in Hawaii every two 11 12 days; and 13 WHEREAS, the Department of Health, Injury Prevention and 14 Control Section, EMS and Injury Prevention System Branch, 15 collaborates with partners across the State to address the 16 leading causes of injury that include drowning prevention, fall 17 prevention, poisoning prevention, suicide prevention, traffic 18 safety, and violence and abuse prevention; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the EMS and Injury Prevention System Branch 21 sponsors suicide intervention trainings, such as ASIST, which is 22 a two-day interactive workshop designed to help caregivers 23 recognize risk and learn how to intervene to prevent the 24 immediate risk of suicide; CONNECT, which are workshops that 25 train professionals and communities in suicide prevention and 26 response; and safeTALK, which provides training to recognize a 27 person at risk for suicide and to connect the person with a 28 29 person trained in suicide first aid intervention; and 30 WHEREAS, a review of the foregoing programs and related 31 activities should be conducted to evaluate the effectiveness of 32 33 suicide prevention training; now, therefore,



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BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2017, that the Department of Health is requested to study the effectiveness of suicide prevention training; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature not later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2018; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health.
