A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WAHIAWA GENERAL HOSPITAL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The Wahiawa Hospital Association was founded in
- 2 1944 in response to the healthcare needs of the community
- 3 following the attack on Pearl Harbor. Several years later,
- 4 Wahiawa General Hospital, a nonprofit, community hospital was
- 5 established to further meet the growing needs of central Oahu.
- 6 Wahiawa General Hospital is centrally located on the island of
- 7 Oahu, serving the surrounding communities of central Oahu and
- ${f 8}$ the north shore. Today, the hospital is a fifty-three bed acute
- 9 facility and has one hundred seven beds in the long-term care
- 10 facility that are equipped for all levels of patient care and
- 11 accredited by The Joint Commission.
- 12 However, the hospital struggles to keep its doors open
- 13 without financial assistance from the State. Since the regular
- 14 session of 1983, the legislature has appropriated a total of:
- 15 (1) \$7,200,000 as a grant or subsidy for operating costs;
- 16 (2) \$3,750,000 in general obligation bond revenues for
- 17 capital improvement projects; and



1 (3) \$84,600,000 in special purpose revenue bonds for 2 financing or refinancing construction projects. 3 Most notably during the regular session of 2016, the legislature 4 appropriated \$2,500,000 from the general fund as a subsidy for 5 operating costs of the hospital. 6 The legislature notes that additional assistance has been 7 provided to the hospital to enable it to continue to provide 8 medical care and services. For over fifteen years, the hospital 9 has attempted to merge or affiliate with a larger healthcare 10 system and relocate its current acute care services to a larger 11 service area, such as Koa Ridge, to create a sustainable 12 business model. This has been the desire and goal of the past 13 and present boards of directors of the hospital since the late 14 1990s. Recently, the hospital attempted to form an affiliation 15 with The Queen's Health Systems, Hawaii Pacific Health, Castle 16 Medical Center, and Sutter Health. However, after being unable to affiliate with these local providers, the hospital management 17 18 and board of directors entered into a contract with Community 19 Hospital Corporation from Plano, Texas. 20 The Community Hospital Corporation is a tax-exempt 21 corporation dedicated to assisting rural hospitals in the United 1

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hospitals and larger hospitals with up to one hundred fifty 2 3 The corporation owns four acute care hospitals and provides ownership and management services to ten long-term 4 5 acute care providers. In addition, the corporation provides a 6 wide range of consulting services to many hospitals on the 7 mainland and has substantial experience in successfully 8 operating and turning around troubled hospitals. 9 On October 21, 2016, the Wahiawa General Hospital board of 10 directors entered into a three-year contract with Community 11 Hospital Corporation to provide a benchmark based assessment of 12 the hospital's current operations, develop a new operating plan 13 or business plan, and provide a new chief executive officer and 14 new chief financial officer. It is important to note that the 15 corporation will be responsible for restructuring operations and 16 management services within Wahiawa General Hospital, but that 17 this contract does not establish an ownership agreement with the 18 The corporation will have the authority and 19 responsibility to recommend and implement changes to the daily 20 operations of the hospital, and the assessment and operating

States. The corporation specializes in critical access

- 1 plan will provide recommendations to enable the hospital to
- 2 operate sustainably to decrease state funding support.
- 3 The legislature further finds that Wahiawa General Hospital
- 4 has acquired debt over the years. For example, the debt owed to
- 5 the Pension Benefit Guarantee Corporation, which is primarily a
- 6 \$6,000,000 payment-in-kind note, will most likely require
- 7 restructuring at some point during the ten-year period of the
- 8 debt. A major balloon payment is due in approximately 8.5
- 9 years. The hospital recognizes that this issue will not be
- 10 resolved for a few years. It should be noted that the original
- 11 note to the Pension Benefit Guarantee Corporation was negotiated
- 12 down from approximately \$22,000,000 to the \$6,000,000 payment-
- 13 in-kind note plus a smaller fixed payment per year over ten
- 14 years.
- 15 Furthermore, debt owed to Central Pacific Bank was
- 16 restructured in May 2015 to fully amortize the remaining balance
- 17 in approximately five years. It should be noted that the
- 18 principal owed a few years ago was over \$6,000,000 and had been
- 19 reduced to below \$1,000,000 as of the end of October 2016. The
- 20 re-amortization agreement entered into in 2015 reduced the debt

- 1 service payments from approximately \$75,000 per month to
- 2 approximately \$24,200 per month.
- 3 The legislature further notes that a business plan is
- 4 necessary to facilitate a relocation of Wahiawa General
- 5 Hospital's medical services. The Wahiawa General Hospital
- 6 settlement agreement with Castle and Cooke, with respect to
- 7 twenty-eight acres of Castle and Cooke owned land, does not
- 8 permit banking of unused land for unspecified future use or sale
- 9 by the hospital. The hospital needs to have a defined and
- 10 approved business plan for certain medical services before
- 11 Castle and Cooke will transfer the respective parcels of land.
- 12 Also, the hospital will need to obtain certain permits for the
- 13 development before Castle and Cooke will transfer the land to
- 14 the hospital under the settlement agreement. The hospital has
- 15 until April 2018 to develop a business plan for presentation to
- 16 Castle and Cooke to transfer twenty-eight acres to the hospital
- 17 to be used for medical services.
- 18 Accordingly, the legislature finds that it is in the public
- 19 interest to keep Wahiawa General Hospital operating to serve the
- 20 residents of central Oahu and allow the hospital to continue

- 1 operations, preserve its hospital license, reorganize, relocate,
- 2 and settle its debts.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the Hawaii health
- 4 systems corporation to bring Wahiawa General Hospital under its
- 5 governance through formal affiliation with the corporation and
- 6 to provide for transitional facilitation by the director of
- 7 health.
- 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 323F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 10 and to read as follows:
- 11 "§323F- Acquisition of Wahiawa General Hospital. (a)
- 12 Wahiawa General Hospital on Oahu may be assimilated into the
- 13 corporation in a manner and to an extent that may be negotiated
- 14 between the corporation and Wahiawa General Hospital. After
- 15 assimilation, the physical assets and the ground lease of
- 16 Wahiawa General Hospital shall become the property of the
- 17 corporation, and Wahiawa General Hospital shall be operated by
- 18 the corporation.
- 19 (b) None of the liabilities of Wahiawa General Hospital
- 20 shall become liabilities of the corporation.

1 The corporation, at its discretion, may retain any or 2 all medical and nonmedical employees of Wahiawa General 3 Hospital. 4 (d) The corporation, without regard to section 323F-31, 5 may adjust the levels of services provided by Wahiawa General 6 Hospital. 7 (e) Wahiawa General Hospital shall be exempt from chapter 8 102 and section 103-53, and its board of directors, if any, 9 shall be exempt from part I of chapter 92. 10 The purchase of goods and services by or on behalf of (f) 11 Wahiawa General Hospital shall be exempt from chapters 103D and 12 103F. 13 (g) Employees of Wahiawa General Hospital shall be exempt 14 from chapters 76, 87A, 88, and 89, and shall not be considered 15 as employees of the State." 16 SECTION 3. Wahiawa General Hospital; acquisition by Hawaii **17** health systems corporation; transitional facilitation by the 18 director of health. The director of health, as an interested

4	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
5	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
6	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 to
7	carry out the purposes of this Act, including the hiring of
8	necessary staff.
9	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
10	health for the purposes of this Act.
11	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
13	provided that section 4 shall take effect on July 1, 2017, and
14	section 3 shall be repealed upon:
15	(1) The receipt of a letter by the director of health from
16	the board of directors of the Hawaii health systems
17	corporation officially notifying the director of
18	health that the acquisition of Wahiawa General
19	Hospital by the corporation has been successfully
20	completed; and

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1	(2)	The	issuanc	e of	a procla	amati	ion by	the	governor	that
