A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PHARMACY BENEFIT MANAGERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that pharmacy benefit SECTION 1. 2 managers are administrators of prescription drug programs and 3 are responsible for developing and maintaining formularies and 4 other clinical management programs, processing prescription drug 5 claims for insurance companies or corporations, and negotiating contracts with pharmaceutical manufacturers. Pharmacy benefit 6 managers also perform utilization reviews, manage clinical 7 8 programs targeted to specific disease states, and operate 9 pharmacies, including mail order and specialty pharmacies. 10 the past decade, the role of pharmacy benefit managers in the 11 delivery of health care has increased due to a variety of 12 factors, including coverage expansions under the medicare Part D 13 prescription drug benefit and the federal Affordable Care Act 14 and an increase in prescription drug spending that has motivated 15 commercial health plans and self-insured employers to outsource the management of their spending on outpatient prescription 16 17 drugs.

1	The legislature further finds that the actions of pharmacy				
2	benefit managers can have wide-ranging impacts on pharmacies and				
3	consumers in Hawaii, particularly those consumers in rural areas				
4	who may have limited access to pharmacies within a pharmacy				
5	benefit manager's network. Despite these potential impacts,				
6	pharmacy benefit managers are not currently required to be				
7	registered.				
8	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require pharmacy				
9	benefit managers in Hawaii to register with the insurance				
10	commissioner.				
11	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by				
12	adding a new chapter to title 24 to be appropriately designated				
13	and to read as follows:

16	§ -A Definitions. As used in this chapter:				
17	"Commissioner" means the insurance commissioner.				
18	"Covered entity" means:				
19	(1) A health benefits plan regulated under chapter 87A,				
20	health insurer regulated under article 10A of chapter				
21	431, mutual benefit society regulated under article 1				

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1	of chapter 432, or health maintenance organization
2	regulated under chapter 432D;
3	(2) A health program administered by the State in the
4	capacity of a provider of health coverage; or
5	(3) An employer, labor union, or other group of persons
6	organized in the State that provides health coverage
.7	to covered persons employed or residing in the State.
8	"Covered entity" shall not include any plans issued for coverage
9	for federal employees or specified disease or limited benefit
10	health insurance as provided by section 431:10A-102.5.
11	"Covered person" means a member, policyholder, subscriber,
12	enrollee, beneficiary, dependent, or other individual
13	participating in a prescription drug benefit plan.
14	"Person" means an individual, partnership, corporation,
15	organization, or other business entity.
16	"Pharmacy benefit management" means:
17	(1) Any of the following services provided with regard to
18	the administration of pharmacy benefits:
19	(A) Mail service pharmacy;

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1		(B)	Claims processing, retail network management, and
2			payment of claims to pharmacies for prescription
3			drugs dispensed to covered persons;
4		(C)	Clinical formulary development and management
5			services;
6		(D)	Rebate contracting and administration;
7		(E)	Certain patient compliance, therapeutic
8			intervention, and generic substitution programs;
9			or
10		(F)	Disease management programs involving
11			prescription drug utilization;
12	(2)	The	procurement of prescription drugs by a pharmacy
13		bene	fit manager at a negotiated rate for dispensation
14		to c	overed persons in the State; or
15	(3)	The	administration or management of prescription drug
16		bene	fits provided by a covered entity for the benefit
17		of c	overed persons.
18	"Pha:	rmacy	benefit manager" means any person that performs
19	pharmacy 1	benef	it management, including but not limited to a
20	person or	enti	ty in a contractual or employment relationship

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- 1 with a pharmacy benefit manager to perform pharmacy benefit
- 2 management for a covered entity.
- 3 "Prescription drug benefit plan" means a health insurance
- 4 plan offered by a covered entity that includes coverage for
- 5 prescription drugs.
- 7 pharmacy benefit manager that provides claims processing
- 8 services, other prescription drug or device services, or both,
- 9 to covered persons who are residents of the State.
- 10 § -C Registration required. (a) Notwithstanding any
- 11 law to the contrary, no person shall act or operate as a
- 12 pharmacy benefit manager without first obtaining a valid
- 13 registration issued by the commissioner pursuant to this
- 14 chapter.
- 15 (b) Each person seeking to register as a pharmacy benefit
- 16 manager shall file with the commissioner an application on a
- 17 form prescribed by the commissioner. The application shall
- 18 include:
- 19 (1) The name, address, official position, and professional
- qualifications of each individual who is responsible
- 21 for the conduct of the affairs of the pharmacy benefit

1		manager, including all members of the board of
2		directors; board of trustees; executive commission;
3		other governing board or committee; principal
4		officers, as applicable; partners or members, as
5		applicable; and any other person who exercises control
6		or influence over the affairs of the pharmacy benefit
7		manager;
8	(2)	The name and address of the applicant's agent for
9		service of process in the State; and
10	(3)	A nonrefundable application fee of \$140.
11	§ ·	-D Annual renewal requirement. (a) Each pharmacy
12	benefit ma	anager shall renew its registration by March 31 each
13	year.	
14	(b)	When renewing its registration, a pharmacy benefit
15	manager sl	hall submit to the commissioner the following:
16	(1)	An application for renewal on a form prescribed by the
17		director; and
18	(2)	A renewal fee of \$140.
19	(c)	Failure on the part of a pharmacy benefit manager to
20	renew its	registration as provided in this section shall result

in a penalty of \$140 and may cause the registration to be

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- 1 revoked or suspended by the commissioner until the requirements
- 2 for renewal have been met.
- 3 § -E Penalty. Any person who acts as a pharmacy benefit
- 4 manager in this State without first being registered pursuant to
- 5 this chapter shall be subject to a fine of \$500 for each
- 6 violation.
- 8 repeal rules pursuant to chapter 91 to carry out the purposes of
- 9 this chapter."
- 10 SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 11 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 12 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 13 the new sections in this Act.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
