A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 PART I

2 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that homelessness 3 continues to be one of the State's most significant and 4 challenging social problems. According to the 2016 Hawaii 5 statewide homeless point-in-time count conducted in January 6 2016, there are 7,921 homeless individuals in the State, an 7 overall increase of four per cent from 2015. Homeless persons 8 face a myriad of issues, including general health issues, mental 9 illness, and substance abuse. These issues affecting homeless 10 persons also impact the general population through the costs of 11 social and health care services. In fiscal years 2014 and 2015, 12 The Queen's Medical Center reported treating 3,441 patients who 13 were homeless. Treating these homeless individuals is sometimes 14 uncompensated, as is the case with an unsheltered patient who

reportedly received treatment 12,271 times over two years, which

cost The Queen's Medical Center more than \$5,000,000 per year.

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1	The registature further finds that mobile clinics are
2	increasing in popularity across the nation as government
3	entities find ways to address the health care needs of the
4	homeless population. In places such as Denver, Colorado;
5	Seattle, Washington; and San Jose, California, mobile clinics
6	offer a variety of free health care services for local homeless
7	populations, saving significant costs on emergency room visits.
8	The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds for
9	establishing, staffing, and operating two mobile clinics to
10	serve the homeless population.
11	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
12	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,400,000 or so much
13	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the
14	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
15	2018-2019 to purchase, staff, and operate two mobile clinics to
16	serve the homeless population; provided that:
17	(1) The staff shall include, at minimum, one doctor, one
18	nurse, one pharmacist, and one psychiatrist and may
19	include staff as needed, including students pursing a
20	degree in medicine or nursing; and

1	(2)	The	mobile clinics may provide, at minimum, the
2		foll	owing services:
3		(A)	Non-emergency medical services for chronic,
4			acute, and episodic conditions;
5		(B)	Sexually transmitted diseases, human
6			immunodeficiency virus, and hepatitis testing;
7	·	(C)	Family planning;
8		(D)	Child and family services;
9		(E)	Behavioral health and substance abuse services;
10		(F)	Mental health services;
11		(G)	Dental care;
12		(H)	Referral services;
13		(I)	Shower and laundry services;
14		(J)	Clean clothing;
15		(K)	Health insurance enrollment;
16		(L)	Pharmacy services; and
17		(M)	Other assistance services.
18	The	sums	appropriated shall be expended by the department
19	of human	servi	ces for the purposes of this part.
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1 SECTION 3. The legislature finds that the need for 2 specialty shelters has grown over the years as homelessness has 3 evolved. Homeless persons have few options to receive home 4 care, mental health stabilization, a recovery environment for 5 substance use disorders, or other support when they leave an 6 acute treatment environment. Specialty shelters double as 7 housing navigation centers wherein staff will assist homeless 8 persons to access housing after their stay at the shelter. 9 The purpose of this part is to appropriate funds for 10 specialty shelters to temporarily house and serve homeless 11 persons. 12 There is appropriated out of the general 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,350,000 or so much 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the 15 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 16 2018-2019 to establish two substance abuse specialty shelters 17 and one mental health specialty shelter to provide temporary 18 housing and specialized homecare services for homeless 19 individuals. 20 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department

of human services for the purposes of this part.

I	PART III
2	SECTION 5. The purpose of this part is to appropriate
3	funds to study the impact and feasibility of creating an
4	integrated database with certain records of homeless individuals
5	for providers of homeless services to track services and
6	optimize costs.
7	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
8	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much
9	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the
10	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
11	2018-2019 for the department of human services to conduct a
12	study on the impact and feasibility of creating an integrated
13	database for providers of homeless services that provides access
14	to certain information about homeless individuals served,
15	including police, medical, social services, and mental health
16	records, to improve tracking services provided and optimize
17	costs.
18	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
19	of human services for the purposes of this part.

PART IV

- 1 SECTION 7. (a) The governor shall establish puuhonua safe
- 2 zones where homeless persons may reside in the State.
- 3 (b) The location of each puuhonua safe zone shall be
- 4 designated by the land use commission.
- 5 (c) Each puuhonua safe zone shall be furnished with
- 6 appropriate hygiene facilities and security and social services
- 7 as deemed necessary.
- 8 (d) The peaceful consumption of alcoholic beverages by
- 9 persons twenty-one years of age or older shall be permitted in
- 10 puuhonua safe zones.
- 11 (e) Animal companions of homeless persons shall be
- 12 permitted in puuhonua safe zones.
- 13 (f) The governor shall maintain and operate puuhonua safe
- 14 zones until the legislature determines that homelessness is no
- 15 longer a crisis in the State.
- 16 (g) The governor may delegate the duties and
- 17 responsibilities established pursuant to subsections (a), (c),
- 18 and (f), of this part to an executive agency.
- 19 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and

- 1 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 2 year 2018-2019 for the establishment of puuhonua safe zones
- 3 where homeless persons may reside in the State.
- 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 5 the governor for the purposes of this part.
- 6 PART V
- 7 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
- 10 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 11 year 2018-2019 for homeless outreach services.
- 12 SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 14 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
- 15 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 16 year 2018-2019 for the storage of homeless people's property.
- 17 SECTION 11. The sums appropriated in this part shall be
- 18 expended by the department of human services for the purposes of
- 19 this part.

20 PART VI

	SECTION 12. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
3	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
4	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
5	year 2018-2019 for outreach services to homeless persons with
6	serious and persistent mental illness.
7	SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the general
8	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
9	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
10	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
11	year 2018-2019 for outreach, counseling, and diversion services
12	for unsheltered homeless persons experiencing substance abuse.
13	SECTION 14. The sums appropriated in this part shall be
14	expended by the department of health for the purposes of this
15	part.
16	PART VII
17	SECTION 15. There is appropriated out of the general
18	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
19	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
20	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
21	year 2018-2019 to assist the highways division of the department

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- 1 of transportation to deal with homelessness-related issues
- pertaining to security, health, and safety.
- 3 The sums appropriated in this part shall be expended by the
- 4 department of transportation for the purposes of this part.

5 PART VIII

6 SECTION 16. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.

Homelessness; Omnibus; Homeless Services; Appropriation

Description:

Part I: Appropriates funds for establishing, staffing, and operating two mobile clinics to serve the homeless population. Part II: Appropriates funds for establishing three specialty shelters to temporarily house and serve homeless individuals. Part III: Appropriates funds to the department of human services to study the impact and feasibility of creating an integrated database of certain information related to homeless individuals for providers of homeless services. Part IV: Requires the governor to establish puuhonua safe zones where homeless persons may reside. Appropriates funds. Part V: Appropriates funds for homeless outreach services and storage of homeless people's property. Part VI: Appropriates funds for outreach services to homeless persons with serious and persistent mental illness. Appropriates funds for services for homeless persons experiencing substance abuse. Part VII: Appropriates funds to assist the department of transportation with homelessness-related issues pertaining to security, health, and safety.

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
