A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY INNOVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Chapter 206M, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
 to read as follows:

4 "PART TECHNOLOGY INNOVATION CORPORATION 5 §206M-A Establishment of the technology innovation corporation; purpose. (a) There is established, as a body 6 7 corporate, the technology innovation corporation. The 8 technology innovation corporation shall be a public, 9 not-for-profit organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The technology 10 innovation corporation shall be attached to the high technology 11 development corporation for administrative purposes. 12

(b) The purpose of the technology innovation corporation shall include but not be limited to the facilitation of the growth and development of the commercial high technology industry in Hawaii. Its duties shall include but not be limited to:



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1 (1) Planning, creating, and implementing any programs and projects of the development corporation that shall be 2 assigned to the technology innovation corporation, 3 including federally- and state-funded programs and 4 projects and those programs funded by other nonprofit 5 6 and for-profit organizations; Identifying and obtaining funding and other resources 7 (2) 8 in support of the purposes of the technology 9 innovation corporation and the development corporation

10 from agencies and organizations not able to provide 11 resources directly to the development corporation; 12 (3) Assisting the development corporation in the promotion 13 and marketing of Hawaii as a location for commercial 14 high technology activity; and

15 (4) Assisting the development corporation in any other
16 strategic or operational manner that supports the
17 State's technology-based economic development
18 activities.

19 (c) The technology innovation corporation shall implement20 this purpose by:



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1 (1) Furnishing the means, methods, and agencies by which 2 the management, programming, training, investigation, 3 research, and analysis may be conducted; Other means to make the benefits of programming, 4 (2) training, investigation, research, and analysis 5 available to the public; and 6 7 Any and all other acts reasonably designed to promote (3) 8 the foregoing purposes in the interest of promoting 9 the general welfare of the people of the State. 10 The technology innovation corporation shall have the sole right 11 to provide the foregoing services and support to the development 12 corporation, and the development corporation shall use the technology innovation corporation to provide these services and 13 14 support in every case, except when the development corporation determines that the technology innovation corporation may not or 15 cannot legally or operationally provide these services and 16 17 support. 18 §206M-B Board of directors; composition. (a) The affairs of the technology innovation corporation shall be under the 19 general management and control of a board of directors. The 20



1 board of directors shall consist of the following seven voting 2 members: 3 The executive director and chief executive officer of (1)4 the high technology development corporation, as an ex 5 officio member; Three members appointed by the governor; 6 (2) 7 Two members appointed by the president of the senate; (3) 8 and 9 (4) Two members appointed by the speaker of the house of 10 representatives; 11 provided that all non ex officio members shall be appointed on the basis of their knowledge, interest, and proven expertise in, 12 but not limited to one or more of the following fields: 13 14 finance, commerce and trade, corporate management, marketing, 15 economics, engineering, information technology and 16 telecommunications, life sciences, and other high technology fields. All non ex officio members shall serve for a term of 17 18 four years, except that half of those initially appointed may 19 have reduced terms in accordance with section 26-34 so as to 20 provide, as nearly as can be, for the expiration of an equal



number of terms at intervals of one year, with each term 1 2 commencing on July 1 and expiring on June 30. 3 (b) All members of the technology innovation corporation's 4 board shall serve without pay but shall be entitled to reimbursement for necessary expenses, including travel expenses, 5 6 while attending meetings and while in the discharge of duties 7 and responsibilities. 8 The members of the technology innovation corporation's (C) 9 board shall elect the chairperson of the board. 10 §206M-C Powers of the board. The technology innovation 11 corporation, under the direction of its board of directors, 12 shall have the following general powers: 13 To adopt, amend, and repeal bylaws governing the (1) 14 conduct of its business and the exercise of the powers. 15 and performance of duties granted to or imposed upon 16 it by law; 17 (2) To sell, lease, rent, hold, maintain, use, and operate any property, real, personal, or mixed, tangible or 18 19 intangible, in accordance with the conditions under 20 which it was received;



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1 (3) To enter into and perform contracts, leases, 2 cooperative agreements, or other transactions with the 3 development corporation or any other agency or political subdivision of the State, any private 4 5 person, firm, partnership, association, company, or 6 corporation, only as it may be necessary in the 7 conduct of its business and on terms as it may deem 8 appropriate; provided that the technology innovation 9 corporation shall not obligate any funds of the State 10 except funds that have been appropriated to it by the 11 legislature or transferred or contracted to it by the development corporation or other agency or department 12 of the state government. Notwithstanding the 13 14 foregoing, the technology innovation corporation may enter into and perform contracts, leases, cooperative 15 agreements, or other transactions with any agency or 16 instrumentality of the United States, a foreign 17 nation, a state, a territory or a possession, or with 18 any political subdivision thereof, whenever the 19 donating or granting agency or instrumentality 20 21 determines that the development corporation or any



1 other agency of the State cannot as effectively and 2 efficiently accomplish the purposes for which the 3 contracts, leases, cooperative agreements, or other 4 transactions are being entered into; provided that the 5 technology innovation corporation shall not obligate 6 any funds of the State except funds that have been 7 appropriated or transferred to it or contracted for 8 it;

To receive by gifts, grants, devises, bequests, or 9 (4) 10 other awards from private sources only, any property, 11 real, personal, or mixed, intangible or tangible, 12 absolutely or in trust, to be used and disposed of, 13 either the principal or the income therefrom, in 14 accordance with the conditions under which it was 15 received; provided that no gift to the technology 16 innovation corporation shall be accepted unless 17 approved or confirmed by its board of directors. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the technology 18 19 innovation corporation may receive gifts, grants, 20 devises, bequests, or other awards from any agency or 21 instrumentality of the United States, a foreign



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1 nation, a state, a territory or a possession, or from any political subdivision thereof, whenever the 2 3 donating or granting agency or instrumentality determines that the development corporation or any 4 other agency of the State cannot as effectively and 5 efficiently accomplish the purposes for which the 6 7 gifts, grants, devises, bequests, or other awards are being made; provided that no such receipt of moneys to 8 the technology innovation corporation shall be 9 10 accepted unless approved or confirmed by its board of 11 directors; (5) To have a corporate seal; 12 13 (6) To sue and be sued in its own name; To serve as trustee or beneficiary under terms of any 14 (7)gift, indenture, or will; 15 To apply for, take out, receive by purchase or gift, 16 (8) 17 hold, administer, and dispose of copyrights, patent rights, licenses, assignments of inventions, 18 discoveries, processes, and other property, rights, or 19 interests therein, and the income thereof, absolutely 20 or subject to conditions or trusts as may be attached 21



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1 thereto or be imposed thereon, and to obligate itself 2 to perform and execute any and all conditions or 3 trusts; To conduct programs, projects, research, studies, 4 (9) experiments, investigations, and tests in all fields 5 6 of knowledge; to promote and develop the scientific 7 and commercial value of inventions, discoveries, and 8 processes; and to make, publish, and distribute the 9 results thereof; 10 (10) To coordinate and correlate activities and projects of the technology innovation corporation with the work of 11 12 state agencies for the purpose of relating research work to the economic development of the State whenever 13 14 practical or desirable; 15 (11)To stimulate and promote cooperative research projects 16 and activities; 17 To establish and maintain or to assist in establishing (12)18 and maintaining staff positions for the purpose of aiding in technology-based economic development, and 19 20 to enter into agreements or contracts with other 21 corporations, organizations, institutions, or persons



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1 for this purpose and to pay the necessary and 2 appropriate expenses therefor; 3 (13) To prepare, print, or publish any manuscript, research 4 article, report, study, discussion, reference, 5 collection, or any pictorial or schematic 6 representation or group or collection thereof, whether 7 the same belongs to or is the work of any state agency 8 or its employees, or the technology innovation 9 corporation or its employees or a contractor of the 10 technology innovation corporation. The printing or 11 publication may be accomplished through whatever 12 person, company, or agency is deemed most appropriate 13 by the board of directors; and 14 (14)To do any or all other acts reasonably necessary to 15 carry out the objects and purposes of the technology 16 innovation corporation. 17 §206M-D Technology innovation corporation; exempt from 18 certain state laws. To carry out the purposes and objectives of 19 this part, the technology innovation corporation shall be granted flexibility in hiring its personnel and in handling and 20

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disbursing moneys by being exempt from the following state laws 1 2 in the Hawaii Revised Statutes: 3 Sections 36-27 and 36-30, relating to special fund (1) reimbursements to the state general fund; 4 (2)Section 78-1, relating to public employment; and 5 6 Chapter 76, relating to civil service. (3) 7 §206M-E Officers and employees of the technology 8 innovation corporation. The executive director and chief 9 executive officer of the development corporation shall be the president of the technology innovation corporation. 10 The technology innovation corporation's board of directors may also 11 appoint other officers and employees as may be necessary in 12 13 administering the affairs of the technology innovation corporation. The technology innovation corporation's board of 14 directors shall set the employees' duties, responsibilities, 15 salaries, holidays, vacations, leaves, hours of work, and 16 working conditions and may grant other benefits as it deems 17 necessary. New employees of the technology innovation 18 corporation shall not be entitled to any benefits conferred 19 20 under chapter 76, 78, 88, or 89, or any public employee collective bargaining agreement, executive order, executive 21



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directive, or rule; provided that any existing officer or employee of the State whose functions are transferred by this part shall not suffer any loss of salary, seniority, prior service credit, vacation, sick leave, or other employee benefit or privilege as a consequence of this part.

6 §206M-F Annual report. The technology innovation 7 corporation shall submit an annual report no later than twenty 8 days prior to the convening of each regular session of the 9 legislature, to the governor, president of the senate, and the 10 speaker of the house of representatives. The report shall include but not be limited to the technology innovation 11 corporation's audited financial statement, total amount of 12 payroll and other disbursements made, and progress and 13 14 accomplishments made during the year.

15 §206M-G Dissolution. If the technology innovation
16 corporation is dissolved, all of its property, real, personal,
17 and mixed and wheresoever situated, shall vest immediately and
18 absolutely in the development corporation, and none of its
19 property shall inure to the benefit of any officer, director, or
20 member of the technology innovation corporation.



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§206M-H Patents, copyrights, and other rights. Any
 patents, copyrights, inventions, discoveries, or other rights
 arising from technology innovation corporation activities shall
 belong to the technology innovation corporation and be subject
 to policies or rules as the technology innovation corporation
 board of directors may adopt.

7 §206M-I Contracts with state agencies. Any contract
8 between the technology innovation corporation and any agency,
9 office, department, or other administrative subdivision of the
10 executive branch of the State shall include the following:

11 (1) Its termination date;

12 (2) Its intent and purpose;

13 (3) A statement establishing the full permissible extent14 of its applicability; and

15 (4) A description of the circumstances under which it may16 be amended or extended.

17 §206M-J Technology innovation corporation special fund;
18 established. (a) There is established in the state treasury a
19 fund to be known as the technology innovation corporation
20 special fund, into which shall be deposited appropriations by
21 the legislature.



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(b) Moneys in the special fund shall be used for the
 duties and purposes of the technology innovation corporation
 pursuant to section 206M-A."

4 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000 or so much 6 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the 7 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 8 2018-2019 to be deposited into the technology innovation 9 corporation special fund established by section 206M-J, Hawaii 10 Revised Statutes.

11 There is appropriated out of the technology innovation 12 corporation special fund the sum of \$200,000 or so much thereof 13 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum 14 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 15 for the purposes set forth in section 206M-J, Hawaii Revised 16 Statutes, established by section 1 of this Act.

17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the technology18 innovation corporation for the purposes of this Act.

19 SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section20 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute



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1 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating

2 the new sections in this Act.
