A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO POLICE REPORTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 52D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§52D- Request for copy of police report by surviving
- 5 immediate family member. (a) A surviving immediate family
- 6 member of a victim of any of the following offenses shall be
- 7 allowed access to a copy of the closing report prepared by the
- 8 investigating police department, upon the conclusion of all
- 9 criminal and civil proceedings that arose from the offense:
- 10 (1) Murder in the first degree, section 707-701;
- 11 (2) Murder in the second degree, section 707-701.5; or
- 12 (3) Manslaughter, section 707-702.
- (b) This section shall not diminish the ability of a
- 14 surviving immediate family member or any other person to request
- 15 a copy of any other portion of a police report or any other
- 16 government record.
- 17 (c) As used in this section:



1	"Closing report" means the final report or similar summary
2	of the investigation that is prepared by the assigned police
3	detective in the normal course of investigating the offense.
4	"Surviving immediate family member" means a person who is a
5	surviving grandparent, parent, sibling, spouse or reciprocal
6	beneficiary, child, or legal guardian of a deceased victim.
7	"Victim" means a person against whom any of the offenses
8	enumerated in subsection (a) was committed."
9	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
10	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
11	begun before its effective date.
12	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Allows surviving immediate family members of murder or manslaughter victims to access a copy of the closing report prepared by the investigating police department, upon the conclusion of all criminal and civil proceedings that arose from the offense. (SD1)
