## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD CARE PROVIDERS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 346-157, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[{]\$346-157[}] Liability insurance coverage[; no]
- 4 requirement. [(a) For the purpose of this section, "liability
- 5 insurance coverage" means a general casualty insurance policy
- 6 issued to a provider insuring against legal liability for injury
- 7 resulting from negligence to a child during the time the child
- 8 is under the care of the child care provider.
- 9 (b) The (a) Beginning January 1, 2019, the department
- 10 shall [not] require a provider to obtain [or] and maintain
- 11 liability insurance coverage as a condition of licensure,
- 12 temporary permission, or registration to operate a child care
- 13 facility.
- 14 [(c) The department, as a condition of continued
- 15 licensure, temporary permission, or registration, shall require
- 16 a provider who does not have liability insurance coverage to

1	disclose in writing that the provider does not have coverage to
2	each parent or guardian:
3	(1) Applying to have a child cared for at the provider's
4	facility, if the provider has no liability insurance
5	coverage at the time of application; or
6	(2) Within seven working days of cancellation or
7	termination of liability insurance coverage if the
8	coverage is canceled or terminated while the parent's
9	or guardian's child is cared for at the provider's
10	facility.
11	(d) (b) The department may suspend or revoke a license,
12	temporary permit, or certificate of registration of a provider
13	in accordance with section 346-164 or 346-175, if the provider
14	or any employee of the provider knowingly makes a false
15	statement to any person concerning the provider's liability
16	insurance coverage.
17	(c) For the purpose of this section, "liability insurance
18	coverage" means a general casualty insurance policy issued to a
19	provider insuring against legal liability for injury resulting
20	from negligence to a child during the time the child is under
21	the care of the child care provider."

- 3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

## Report Title:

Child Care Providers; Liability Insurance Coverage; Requirement

## Description:

Beginning January 1, 2019, requires child care providers licensed or registered by the department of human services to obtain and maintain liability insurance coverage. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD2)

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
