A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 269-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 3 "(a) There shall be a public utilities commission of three
- 4 members, to be called commissioners, and who shall be appointed
- 5 in the manner prescribed in section 26-34, except as otherwise
- 6 provided in this section. All members shall be appointed for
- 7 terms of six years each, except that the terms of the members
- 8 first appointed shall be for two, four, and six years,
- 9 respectively, as designated by the governor at the time of
- 10 appointment. At least one member shall be a resident of a
- 11 county other than the city and county of Honolulu and shall
- 12 receive per diem compensation for the days on which actual
- 13 service is rendered at a rate of per day. The governor
- 14 shall designate a member to be chairperson of the commission.
- 15 Each member shall hold office until the member's successor is
- 16 appointed and qualified. Section 26-34 shall not apply insofar
- 17 as it relates to the number of terms and consecutive number of

- 1 years a member can serve on the commission; provided that no
- 2 member shall serve more than twelve consecutive years.
- 3 In appointing commissioners, the governor shall select
- 4 persons who have had experience in accounting, business,
- 5 engineering, government, finance, law, or other similar fields.
- 6 The commissioners shall devote full time to their duties as
- 7 members of the commission and no commissioner shall hold any
- 8 other public office or other employment during the
- 9 commissioner's term of office. No person owning any stock or
- 10 bonds of any public utility corporation, or having any interest
- in, or deriving any remuneration from, any public utility shall
- 12 be appointed a commissioner."
- 13 SECTION 2. The requirement that at least one of the public
- 14 utilities commission members be a resident of a county other
- 15 than the city and county of Honolulu pursuant to section 1 of
- 16 this Act, shall apply to the next appointment to the commission
- 17 following the effective date of this Act and thereafter.
- 18 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
