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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NURSING FACILITY SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Nursing facilities in the State face major 2 financial challenges in providing quality long-term care for 3 These challenges are largely the result of Hawaii residents. 4 inadequate payments from the medicaid program that do not cover 5 the actual costs of care. Medicaid is jointly financed by the 6 federal and state governments by statutory formula. The federal 7 government pays between fifty per cent and seventy-four per 8 cent, with assistance levels determined by each state's per 9 capita income. States with the lowest per capita income receive 10 higher federal matching rates. Under federal rules, the state 11 share must be public funds that are not federal funds. The 12 legislature finds that public funding to help sustain Hawaii's 13 nursing facilities financially may be accessed through a 14 provider fee.

15 The legislature further finds that provider fees exist in 16 forty-nine states and the District of Columbia as a means of 17 drawing down federal funds to sustain their medicaid programs



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1 due to rising state budget deficits, increasing health care
2 costs, and expanding medicaid enrollment. Provider fees, which
3 are collected from specific categories of health care providers
4 that agree to the fee, may be imposed on nineteen different
5 classes of health care services, including inpatient and
6 outpatient hospital and nursing facility services.

7 The legislature additionally finds that, in Hawaii, a 8 provider fee on nursing facilities has resulted in an increase 9 of medicaid payments at a time when there are constraints on the 10 State's budget. The additional federal funds obtained via the 11 fee program authorized by the nursing facility sustainability 12 program have helped to reduce the amount of losses incurred by 13 long-term care facilities and maintain access to care for 14 medicaid recipients.

15 The purpose of this Act is to preserve access to health 16 care for medicaid recipients by extending the nursing facility 17 sustainability program.

18 SECTION 2. Section 346F-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 19 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 20 "(c) Revenue from the nursing facility sustainability fee 21 shall be used exclusively as follows:



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1 No less than eighty-eight per cent of the revenue from (1)2 the nursing facility sustainability fee shall be used 3 to match federal medicaid funds, with the combined 4 total to be used to enhance capitated rates to 5 medicaid managed care health plans for the purpose of 6 increasing medicaid payments to private nursing 7 facilities; 8 (2) Twelve per cent of the revenue from the nursing 9 facility sustainability fee may be used by the 10 department for other departmental purposes; and 11 (3) All moneys remaining in the special fund on 12 December 30, [2017,] 2019, shall be distributed to 13 nursing facilities within thirty days in the same 14 proportions as received from the nursing facilities." SECTION 3. Section 346F-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 16 amended to read as follows:

17 "[+]§346F-10[+] Enhanced rates to medicaid managed care 18 health plans. In accordance with title 42 Code of Federal 19 Regulations section 438, the department shall use revenues from 20 the nursing facility sustainability fee and federal matching 21 funds to enhance the capitated rates paid to medicaid managed

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1 care health plans for the state fiscal [year 2016-2017] biennium 2 2017-2019, consistent with the following objectives: 3 The rate enhancement shall be used exclusively for (1) 4 increasing reimbursements to private nursing 5 facilities to support the availability of services and 6 to ensure access to care to the medicaid managed care 7 health plan enrollees; 8 (2) The rate enhancement shall be made part of the monthly 9 capitated rates by the department to medicaid managed 10 care health plans, which shall provide documentation 11 to the department and the nursing facility trade 12 association located in Hawaii certifying that the 13 revenues received under paragraph (1) are used in 14 accordance with this section; 15 (3) The rate enhancement shall be actuarially sound and 16 approved by the federal government for federal fund 17 participation; and 18 The department shall modify the fee-for-service (4)19 reimbursement rates of the nursing facilities to 20 recognize the medicaid portion of the nursing facility 21 sustainability fee as an additional cost of serving



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1		medicaid patients, and to provide a uniform percentage
2		increase in preexisting facility-specific rates."
3	SECT	ION 4. Section 346F-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
5	"(a)	Collection of the nursing facility sustainability fee
6	under sect	tion 346F-5 shall be discontinued if:
7	(1)	The waiver in section 346F-7 or the enhanced
8		capitation rates in section 346F-10 have not been
9		approved by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
10		Services;
11	(2)	The department reduces funding for nursing facility
12		services below the state appropriation in effect on
13		June 30, [2016;] <u>2018;</u>
14	(3)	The department or any other state agency uses the
15		money in the special fund for any use other than the
16		uses permitted pursuant to this chapter; or
17	(4)	Federal financial participation to match the nursing
18		facility sustainability fee becomes unavailable under
19		federal law. In such case, the department shall
20		terminate the collection of the fee beginning on the



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effective date of the federal statutory, regulatory, 1 2 or interpretive change." 3 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the nursing 17 facility sustainability program special fund the sum of 18 \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 19 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much there of as may be 20 necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for uses consistent with the nursing facility sustainability program special fund. 21



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1	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
2	of human services for the purposes of this Act.

5	SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020;
6	provided that section 7 shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
