## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NURSING FACILITY SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Nursing facilities in the State face major 2 financial challenges in providing quality long-term care for 3 Hawaii residents. These challenges are largely the result of 4 inadequate payments from the medicaid program that do not cover 5 the actual costs of care. Medicaid is jointly financed by the 6 federal and state governments by statutory formula. The federal 7 government pays between fifty per cent and seventy-four per 8 cent, with assistance levels determined by each state's per 9 capita income. States with the lowest per capita income receive 10 higher federal matching rates. Under federal rules, the state 11 share must be public funds that are not federal funds. 12 legislature finds that public funding to help sustain Hawaii's 13 nursing facilities financially may be accessed through a 14 provider fee. 15 The legislature further finds that provider fees exist in

forty-nine states and the District of Columbia as a means of drawing down federal funds to sustain their medicaid programs

- 1 costs, and expanding medicaid enrollment. Provider fees, which
- 2 are collected from specific categories of health care providers
- 3 that agree to the fee, may be imposed on nineteen different
- 4 classes of health care services, including inpatient and
- 5 outpatient hospital and nursing facility services.
- 6 The legislature additionally finds that, in Hawaii, a
- 7 provider fee on nursing facilities has resulted in an increase
- 8 of medicaid payments at a time when there are constraints on the
- 9 State's budget. The additional federal funds obtained via the
- 10 fee program authorized by the nursing facility sustainability
- 11 program have helped to reduce the amount of losses incurred by
- 12 long-term care facilities and maintain access to care for
- 13 medicaid recipients.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to preserve access to health
- 15 care for medicaid recipients by extending the nursing facility
- 16 sustainability fee program.
