A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECYCLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that S.C.R. No. 74, 2 S.D. 1, H.D. 1, regular session of 2014, requested the office of 3 the auditor to conduct an audit of the department of health's 4 advance disposal fee program. In response, the office of the 5 auditor released Report No. 14-17 in December of 2014, which 6 recommended that the department of health: 7 (1)Consider combining the advance disposal fee and 8 deposit beverage container glass processing streams to 9 increase efficiency and decrease costs while 10 increasing the supply of glass available for down-11 cycling; 12 Update and finalize the 2008 department of health (2) 13 draft policy on glass recycling dated July 1, 2008, 14 to: 15 Equally allow recycling or down-cycling; (A) 16 (B) Clearly allow stockpiling of glass for the 17 purposes of maintaining inventory;

The report shall 2 include: 3 (1) All findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, with regard to combining the 4 5 advance disposal fee glass container and deposit beverage container glass processing streams; 6 7 (2) The updated policy of the 2008 department of health 8 draft policy on glass recycling dated July 1, 2008; (3) All new policies and rules governing the stockpiling 9 10 of processed glass; and 11 (4) Plans to increase the recovery rate for advance 12 disposal fee glass containers to seventy-five per 13 cent. 14 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the 16 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 17 2018-2019 to conduct a cost-benefit analysis of combining the 18 19 glass processing streams for advance disposal fee glass 20 containers and deposit beverage containers.

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- The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 1, 2050.

Description:

Mandates implementation of recommendations made by the office of the auditor to the department of health regarding advance disposal fee glass containers and glass recycling. Requires the department of health to report on its implementation of the recommendations to the legislature. Appropriates funds to the department of health to conduct a cost-benefit analysis of combining the glass processing streams of the advance disposal fee glass containers and deposit beverage containers.
