A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHAPTER 183, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 183-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: "(c) In addition:
 - (1) A fine of an amount up to [\$10,000] the current market value of each koa tree at that location and the cost of restoration or replacement of the habitat per violation of section 183-17 may be levied for each destroyed or harvested koa tree, or portion thereof, larger than six inches in diameter at ground level; and
 - value of each tree or plant, other than koa, at that

 location and the cost of restoration or replacement of

 the habitat per violation of section 183-17 may be

 levied for each destroyed or harvested tree or plant,

 other than koa, or portion thereof, larger than six

 inches in diameter at ground level."

3	For purposes of this subsection, "offense" means a violation of		
4	any provision of this part or any rules adopted pursuant		
5	thereto.		
6	(b) Any person who [violates] is convicted for violating		
7	section 183-17[, upon conviction thereof,] is guilty of a		
8	misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$2,000 or		
9	imprisoned not more than one year, or both. [In addition to any		
10	other penalty imposed under this section, a fine of up to \$2,000		
11	shall be levied for each tree illegally destroyed or harvested		
12	under section 183-17.] "		
13	SECTION 3. Section 183-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
14	repealed.		
15	["§183-4 General penalty. Any person violating any of the		
16	provisions of chapters 183 to 185, for which violation a penalty		
17	is not otherwise provided, or violating any rule or regulation		
18	of the department of land and natural resources, and any master		
19	of any vessel which brings into the State any article which the		
20	department shall at any time prohibit from being imported into		
21	the State, and the master of any vessel from which is landed any

- 2 the master has received a permit to land the articles from the
- 3 department or its officer or inspector, as in such chapters
- 4 provided, shall be fined not more than \$500."]
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 6 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 7 begun before its effective date.
- 8 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.

Report Title:

Penalties; Timber Trespass in Forest Reserves; Destruction or Harvesting of Trees and Plants on State Lands; Koa Trees; Forest Reserve Violations

Description:

Amends fines for the destroying or harvesting of koa trees and other trees and plants on state lands to an amount up to the current market value of each tree or plant at that location and the cost of restoration or replacement of the habitat. Clarifies that any person that violates a provision of part II of chapter 183, HRS (forest reserves), or any rule adopted pursuant thereto, other than section 183-17, HRS, shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor. Repeals the general penalty provision of chapter 183, HRS.
