A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CANDIDATE COMMITTEE REPORTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 11-334, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 2 [The] In an election year, the candidate and 3 "(a) treasurer of the candidate committee of each candidate whose 4 name will appear on the ballot [in the immediately succeeding 5 election] shall file preliminary[7] and final[7 and 6 supplemental] reports. 7 The filing dates for preliminary reports are: 8 (1) Thirty calendar days [prior to] before a primary, 9 (A) initial special, or initial nonpartisan election; 10 Ten calendar days [prior to] before a primary, 11 (B) [each] initial special, or [each] initial 12 13 nonpartisan election; and Ten calendar days [prior to] before a general, 14 (C) subsequent special, or subsequent nonpartisan 15 election; provided that this preliminary report 16 does not need to be filed by a candidate who is 17

1		disuccessful in a primary, initial special, or
2		initial nonpartisan election, or a candidate who
3		is elected to office in the primary, initial

5		The preliminary report filed by the date required

The report shall be current through December 31 for the
report filed on January 31 and current through June 30 for the
report filed on July 31."
SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
