## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 3 established a weighted student formula to allocate moneys to
- 4 schools according to the different costs of educating students
- 5 with different needs. Despite the intended equitable
- $\mathbf{6}$  distribution of funds, the legislature finds that the weighted
- 7 student formula has placed small, remote schools at a
- 8 disadvantage. In the case of Hāna high and elementary school,
- 9 the budgetary shortfall has resulted in the loss of several
- 10 well-qualified teachers and has threatened the school's ability
- 11 to offer minimum course requirements for students to earn high
- 12 school diplomas. If Hāna high school is unable to offer its
- 13 students the requisite courses for graduation, those students
- 14 will have to endure a nearly forty-mile, two-hour drive away, to
- 15 the next closest public high school, King Kekaulike high school.
- 16 The legislature finds that despite the current economic
- 17 situation, remote schools should be funded to retain the minimal

- 1 personnel and resources necessary to graduate students. One way
- 2 to address this is to allow these schools to receive
- 3 supplemental funding based on their remote status.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to authorize supplemental
- 5 categorical funding for remote schools.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by adding a new section be appropriately designated and
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 "§302A- Remote schools categorical funding. (a) For
- 10 the purpose of this section, "remote school" means any public
- 11 school, as defined in section 302A-101, except charter schools
- 12 governed by chapter 302D, that is a high school:
- 13 (1) Located at least a one-hour drive away from the next
- 14 nearest public high school; or
- 15 (2) Located on the island of Lanai, Molokai, or Niihau;
- 16 provided that if a high school is combined with an elementary,
- 17 middle, intermediate, or other lower level of schooling, that
- 18 entire school shall be deemed a high school for the purpose of
- 19 this section.

- 1 (b) Subject to legislative appropriations, a remote school
- 2 may receive supplemental categorical funding to support
- 3 additional instructional and support staff.
- 4 (c) Any supplemental categorical funding provided to a
- 5 remote school pursuant to this section shall be in addition to
- 6 the allocation determined under the weighted student formula
- 7 that is made to the remote school."
- 8 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the
- 11 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 12 2018-2019 for remote schools categorical funding pursuant to
- 13 this Act.
- 14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 15 of education for the purpose of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
