## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. State boards and commissions provide an
- 2 opportunity for a cross-section of Hawaii's residents to offer
- 3 vital input and provide a means of influencing decisions that
- 4 shape the quality of life for the residents of Hawaii. The
- 5 governor nominates and appoints more than one hundred seventy
- 6 boards and commissions established by the Hawaii State
- 7 Constitution, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and executive orders.
- 8 While the term for most boards and commissions is four years,
- 9 term length varies by board or commission.
- 10 The legislature finds that it is imperative that members of
- 11 boards and commissions are appropriately and timely nominated
- 12 and appointed to enable the boards and commissions to meet and
- 13 conduct business.
- 14 The legislature further finds that an accurate and
- 15 comprehensive membership list of all state boards and
- 16 commissions that is monitored and maintained will ensure
- 17 government accountability, transparency, and efficiency.

12		any pending vacancies in accordance with section
13		27-41; and
14	(2) Dire	ct that official documents, vital information, and
15	proc	edural manuals be given to the governor-elect upon
16	the	governor-elect's request."
17	SECTION 5	. There is appropriated out of the general
18	revenues of th	e State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
19	much thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
20	the same sum o	r so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
21	year 2018-2019	for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) position

- 1 to manage the listing of information on all state boards and
- 2 commissions.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 4 the governor for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

### Report Title:

Boards and Commissions; Vacancy; Governor; Database; Listing; Appropriation

### Description:

Requires department heads to inform the governor of any vacancy in any board or commission. Requires the governor to maintain a listing of all boards and commissions including specified information. Appropriates funds for 1.0 FTE position to manage listing information for boards and commissions. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)
