BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

5	(1)	Gifts received by will or intestate succession;
6	(2)	Gifts received by way of distribution of any inter
7		vivos or testamentary trust established by a spouse or
8		ancestor;
9	(3)	Gifts from a spouse, fiance, fiancee, <u>or</u> any relative
10		within four degrees of consanguinity, or the spouse,
11		fiance, or fiancee of such a relative. A gift from
12		any such person is a reportable gift if the person is
13		acting as an agent or intermediary for any person not
14		covered by this paragraph;
15	(4)	Political campaign contributions that comply with
16		state law;



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1	(5)	Anything available to or distributed to the public
2		generally without regard to the official status of the
3		recipient;
4	(6)	Gifts that, within thirty days after receipt, are
5		returned to the giver or delivered to a public body or
6		to a bona fide educational or charitable organization
7		without the donation being claimed as a charitable
8		contribution for tax purposes; [and]
9	(7)	Exchanges of approximately equal value on holidays,
10		[birthday,] <u>birthdays,</u> or special occasions[+]; and
11	(8)	Tangible and nonperishable gifts received by an
12		elected or appointed official on behalf of the State;
13		provided that the gift shall be listed in a public
14		record maintained by the respective state agency as
15		property of the State. Upon the end of the official's
16		term of office, the gift may remain with the
17		official's state agency, or the state agency may
18		transfer the gift to the state archives or state
19		foundation on culture and the arts, as appropriate."

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Report Title: Ethics; Gift Reporting; Elected Officials

Description:

Exempts tangible and nonperishable gifts received by an elected or appointed official on behalf of the State from gift reporting requirements under the ethics code. Requires the gift to be publicly recorded and maintained as property of the State and allows the gift to remain with the official's state agency or be transferred to the state archives or state foundation on culture and the arts at the end of the official's term. (HB631 HD1)
