A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONSERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that human activities 2 have contributed to the fragility of local habitats, leading to a current crisis in the survival of Hawaiian plants and animals 3 4 and impacting public and private land use. Hawaii's endangered 5 species law provides that the intended purpose of all habitat 6 conservation plans, safe harbor agreements, incidental take 7 licenses, and subsequent actions is to increase the population 8 of Hawaii's threatened and endangered species.

9 The legislature further finds that effective implementation 10 of Hawaii's endangered species law requires resources for 11 adequate staffing. Currently, the department of land and 12 natural resources division of forestry and wildlife has three 13 administrative positions to manage statewide projects, plus 14 additional staff supported by grants to produce standalone 15 habitat conservation plans. Increasing staff capacity statewide 16 by fully funding a state civil service position to effectively 17 track and monitor funds and expenditures related to each habitat



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conservation plan project would allow for greater consistency in
issuing incidental take licenses, conducting follow-up
monitoring for development projects, and implementing and
managing of mitigation and other projects that are extremely
beneficial for the recovery of Hawaii's threatened and
endangered species.

7 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and 10 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 11 year 2018-2019 for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) state 12 civil service position to effectively track and monitor funds 13 and expenditures related to habitat conservation plans, conduct 14 follow-up monitoring for development projects, and implement and 15 manage mitigation and other projects that benefit the recovery 16 of threatened and endangered species.

17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department18 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
