#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
  by adding two new sections to part II to be appropriately
  designated and to read as follows:

  "S11-A Applications for a driver's license or civil
  identification card. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the
  contrary, an affidavit on application for voter registration
- 5 shall be a part of the application associated with the issuance
- 8 of a civil identification card under section 286-301 and a
- 9 driver's license under section 286-109.
- (b) Applications for a civil identification card or
- 11 driver's license shall not be processed until the application
- 12 has:
- 13 (1) Been confirmed electronically as a registered voter;
- <u>or</u>
- 15 (2) Applied to register to vote or affirmatively declined
- to register to vote on the application form.

- (c) If an applicant for a civil identification card or 1 driver's license is already a registered voter, the application 2 3 shall serve to automatically update the applicant's voter 4 registration residence address, mailing address, or name, as may 5 be applicable. A notice to this effect shall be stated on any 6 application or change of address or name form used by the 7 examiner of drivers. 8 (d) The examiner of drivers and the department of 9 transportation shall indicate in their databases whether a civil 10 identification card or driver's license holder is a registered 11 voter, in addition to any other information referred to in 12 subsection (e). 13 (e) The examiner of drivers shall electronically transmit to the office of elections, on a real time basis, the following 14 15 information associated with each applicant who is a United States citizen and has not affirmatively declined to register to 16 17 vote or who is already a registered voter: 18 (1) Name;

(3) Last four digits of the social security number;

1 registration applicants under section 11-15.3, ensure the 2 integrity of the voter registration rolls, or for any other 3 election purposes. §11-B Registration as a permanent absentee voter. 4 The 5 submission of a voter registration application either to 6 register to vote or to update a voter's registration information 7 shall constitute a request for permanent absentee voter status 8 under section 15-4, unless the applicant specifically indicates 9 the applicant does not wish to be a permanent absentee voter." 10 SECTION 2. Section 286-109, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 "§286-109 General provision governing the issuance of 13 licenses. (a) Upon payment of the required fee and upon 14 demonstrating the ability to operate a certain category or 15 categories of motor vehicles to the satisfaction of the examiner 16 of drivers, an applicant for a driver's license shall be issued 17 a single license of a design approved by the director of 18 transportation upon which is made a notation of: 19 The category or categories of motor vehicles the (1) 20 applicant may operate;

1	(2)	Any restrictive provisions to which the license is	
2		subject;	
3	(3)	Veteran status, if desired by the applicant; provided	
4		that the notation shall be on the front of the license	
5		and shall not include any designation other than the	
6		term "veteran"; and	
7	(4)	When the license is issued to a person under twenty-	
8		one years of age, a statement, in clearly legible	
9		print that shall contrast with the other information	
10		appearing on the license, which indicates the date on	
11		which the person will attain the age of twenty-one	
12		years.	
13	As used in	n this subsection, "veteran" means any person who	
14	served in any of the uniformed services of the United States,		
15	including	veterans of the Korean conflict and persons who served	
16	in the ar	med forces of the Republic of Korea, who fought under	
17	the command of the United Nations led by the United States,		
18	during the Korean conflict and are currently United States		
19	citizens,	and was discharged under conditions other than	

dishonorable.

1 The examiner of drivers shall not issue or renew any 2 driver's license using the driver's social security number on 3 the driver's license. (c) Statutes of limitations and other provisions of this 4 5 chapter notwithstanding, no driver's license or instruction permit shall be issued or renewed under this section, where the 6 examiner of drivers is notified by the district judge, traffic 7 8 violations bureaus of the district courts, or the judge of the 9 circuit court that the applicant has failed to respond to a traffic citation or summons, or failed to appear in court after 10 an arrest for the violation of any traffic laws of a county, 11 this chapter or chapter 286G, 287, 290, 291, or 291C, or of any 12 13 motor vehicle insurance laws under article 10C of chapter 431, or of any motorcycle or motor scooter insurance laws under 14 article 10G of chapter 431, and the same remains delinquent and 15 outstanding, or the applicant, has as of the time of the **16** application, failed to comply in full with all orders of the 17 court; provided that the district court with whose order an 18 19 applicant has failed to comply in full, may approve the issuance 20 or renewal of a driver's license or instruction permit other than a commercial driver's license upon conditions imposed by 21

1 the court for the satisfaction of the outstanding court order 2 and any other conditions as may be imposed by the court, if one 3 or more of the following conditions are met: 4 (1)The applicant is gainfully employed in a position that 5 requires driving and will be discharged if the 6 applicant is unable to drive; or 7 (2) The applicant has no access to alternative 8 transportation and therefore must drive to work; 9 provided further that if the applicant has failed to comply in full with orders of the district court of more than one circuit, 10 11 the applicant shall obtain the approval of the district court of 12 each circuit in which the applicant has an outstanding court 13 order before a driver's license or instruction permit may be 14 issued or renewed under this subsection. 15 A driver's license or instruction permit issued or renewed 16 under this subsection shall be subject to immediate suspension **17** by the court upon the applicant's failure to remain in full 18 compliance with all conditions imposed by the court for the 19 issuance or renewal of the driver's license or instruction 20 permit. The examiner of drivers may place an indication of restriction upon a driver's license or instruction permit issued 21

- 1 or renewed under this subsection. Proof of financial
- 2 responsibility under section 287-20 shall not apply to the
- 3 issuance or renewal of driver's licenses or instruction permits
- 4 under this subsection.
- 5 (d) An application for a driver's license shall include
- 6 the information required under section 11-A."
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 286-301, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "[+] §286-301[+] Issuance of identification card or
- 10 temporary card. (a) To obtain an identification card from the
- 11 examiner of drivers, an individual shall complete an application
- 12 pursuant to section 286-303.
- 13 (b) The examiner of drivers, upon receipt of the
- 14 application by any individual who is a resident or a temporary
- 15 resident of this State, shall issue an identification card to
- 16 that individual upon receipt of any appropriate fee established
- 17 pursuant to section 286-309.
- 18 (c) The identification card shall be similar in size,
- 19 shape, and design to a driver's license, but shall not entitle
- 20 the individual to whom it is issued to operate a motor vehicle.

- 1 (d) The issuance of an identification card pursuant to
- 2 this section shall not place upon the State of Hawaii or any
- 3 agency any liability for the misuse or the acceptance of the
- 4 identification card as valid identification, which shall be left
- 5 entirely to the discretion of any individual to whom such card
- 6 is presented.
- 7 (e) An application for an identification card from the
- 8 examiner of drivers shall include the information required under
- 9 section 11-A."
- 10 SECTION 4. Section 286-311, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) [All] Except for the purposes under sections 11-A,
- 13 286-109, and 286-301, information and records acquired by the
- 14 examiner of drivers under this part shall be confidential. All
- 15 information and records shall be maintained in an appropriate
- 16 form and in an appropriate office in the custody and under the
- 17 control of the examiner. The information shall be available
- 18 only to authorized individuals under such restrictions as the
- 19 director shall prescribe. The examiner may dispose of any
- 20 application or identification card, or information or record
- 21 relating to the application or identification card, which does

1 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;

2 provided that section 5 shall take effect on January 1, 2018.

#### Report Title:

Voter Registration; Driver's License; Civil Identification Card; Permanent Absentee Voter Status

#### Description:

Requires an affidavit on an application for voter registration to be included as part of the application for driver's licenses and civil identification cards. Prevents processing of application for driver's licenses or civil identification cards unless a voter affidavit is complete or declined. Provides that the submission of a voter registration application either to register to vote or update the voter's registration information constitutes a request for permanent absentee voter status unless the applicant specifically indicates the applicant does not wish to be a permanent absentee voter.
