## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE SMALL BUSINESS REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY ACT.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The purpose of this Act is to provide greater	
2	clarity a	nd effect to the Small Business Regulatory Flexibility	
3	Act with	the following amendments:	
4	(1)	Adopt a more explicit definition of "small business";	
5	(2)	Clarify the powers of the small business regulatory	
6		review board when reviewing administrative rules that	
7		impact small business;	
8	(3)	Increase the number of board members from nine to	
9		eleven; and	
10	(4)	Clarify when reporting by the agencies is required for	
11		submission to the small business regulatory review	
12		board and when reporting by the board is required for	
13		submission to the legislature.	
14	SECT	ION 2. Section 201M-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
15	amended by amending the definition of "small business" to read		
16	as follows:		

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         ""Small business" means a for-profit [enterprise consisting
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    of] corporation, limited liability company, partnership, limited
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    partnership, sole proprietorship, or other legal entity that:

              Is domiciled and authorized to do business in Hawaii;
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              Is independently owned and operated; and

              Employs fewer than one hundred full-time or part-time

         SECTION 3. Section 201M-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
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               There shall be established within the department of
         "(a)
    business, economic development, and tourism, for administrative
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    purposes, a small business regulatory review board to review any
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    proposed new or amended rule [or to]. If the board determines
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    that a proposed rule will not have a significant economic impact
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    on a substantial number of small businesses, the board shall
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    submit a statement to that effect to the agency that sets forth
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    the reason for the board's decision. If the board determines
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    that the proposed rule will have a significant economic impact
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    on a substantial number of small businesses, the board may
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    submit to the agency suggested changes in the proposed rule to
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    minimize the economic impact of the proposed rule, or may
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1	recommend the withdrawar of the proposed fure. The board may		
2	also consider any request from small business owners for review		
3	of any rule adopted by a state agency and to make		
4	recommendations to the agency or the legislature regarding the		
5	need for a rule change or legislation. For requests regarding		
6	county ordinances, the board may make recommendations to the		
7	county council or the mayor for appropriate action.		
8	(b) The board shall consist of [nine] eleven members, who		
9	shall be appointed by the governor pursuant to section 26-34,		
10	provided that:		
11	(1) Three members shall be appointed from a list of		
12	nominees submitted to the president of the senate;		
13	(2) Three members shall be appointed from a list of		
14	nominees submitted by the speaker of the house of		
15	representatives;		
16	(3) $[Two]$ Four members shall be appointed by the governor		
17	(4) The director of business, economic development, and		
18	tourism, or the director's designated representative,		
19	shall serve as an ex officio $[+]$ , $[+]$ voting member of		
20	the board;		

1	(5)	The appointments shall reflect representation of a	
2		variety of businesses in the State;	
3	(6)	No more than two members shall be representatives from	
4		the same type of business; and	
5	(7)	There shall be at least one representative from each	
6		county.	
7	For the purposes of paragraphs (1) and (2), nominations shall be		
8	solicited from small business organizations, state and county		
9	chambers of commerce, and other interested business		
10	organizations."		
11	SECTION 4. Section 201M-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
13	"(a)	Each agency having rules that affect small business	
14	shall submit by June 30 of each odd-numbered year $[\tau]$ to the		
15	board a list of those rules [to the small business regulatory		
16	review board; and a report describing the specific public		
17	purpose or interest for adopting the respective rules that		
18	affect small business and any other reasons to justify their		
19	continued implementation; provided that, by June 30 of each		
20	year, each agency shall submit to the [small business regulator		
21	<del>review</del> ] b	ooard a list of any rules to be amended or repealed,	

1 based upon any new, amended, or repealed statute[. The agency 2 shall also submit a report describing the specific public 3 purpose or interest for adopting the respective rules that 4 affect small business and any other reasons to justify their 5 continued implementation.] that impacts small business." 6 SECTION 5. Section 201M-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 8 The board may solicit testimony from the public 9 regarding any report submitted by the agency under this section **10** at a public meeting held pursuant to chapter 92. Upon 11 consideration of any report submitted by an agency under this 12 section and any public testimony, the board shall submit an 13 evaluation report to the [next regular session of the] 14 legislature[.] prior to the end of the next even-numbered year. 15 The evaluation report shall include an assessment as to whether 16 the public interest significantly outweighs a rule's effect on 17 small business and any legislative proposal to eliminate or 18 reduce the effect on small business. The legislature may take 19 any action in response to the report as it finds appropriate."

- 1 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
