RELATING TO FIRE SPRINKLERS.

CPC, HSG, JUD

Status

Makes permanent the prohibition on the counties from requiring fire sprinklers in specific family dwelling units and agricultural and aquacultural buildings, but allows counties to require sprinklers for any new home that requires a variance from access road or fire fighting water supply requirements.

HB 1461 **Status**

RELATING TO FIRE SPRINKLERS.

CPC, HSG, JUD

Prohibits counties from charging for automatic fire sprinkler or automatic fire sprinkler system inspections in any HHFDC housing projects. Makes permanent the prohibition on counties from requiring installation or retrofitting of automatic fire sprinklers in new or existing one- or two-family dwelling units used only for residential purposes. Repeals the prohibition on counties from requiring installation or retrofitting of automatic fire sprinklers in nonresidential agricultural and aquacultural buildings and structures located outside
