<u>SB 185, SD1</u> (SSCR23) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO CHILD CARE PROVIDERS. Beginning January 1, 2019, requires child care providers licensed or registered by the department of human services to obtain and maintain liability insurance coverage. (SD1)	HMS, CPH
<u>SB 224, SD1</u> (SSCR318) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PSYCHOLOGY. Establishes licensure and registration requirements for school psychologists to be administered by the board of psychology. Amends the composition of the board to include two school psychologists. (SD1)	EDU, CPH
SB 194 (SSCR49) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO TUBERCULOSIS TESTING. Requires the department of health to accept FDA-approved, CDC-recommended tuberculosis (TB) blood tests in addition to the TB skin test for the purpose of obtaining a certificate of TB examination. Amends the law requiring tuberculosis clearance prior to public school entry to be in accordance with law in addition to department of health rules. Clarifies that the department of health's administrative rules regarding the use of the Mantoux tuberculin skin test or chest x-rays in obtaining a certificate of tuberculosis examination shall remain in effect until amended to include the addition of TB blood tests as an acceptable TB diagnostic. <u>SB 708, SD1</u> (<u>SSCR85)</u> <u>Status &</u> <u>Testimony</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LAND. Prohibits the creation of a condominium property regime on agricultural land 25 acres or greater. Prohibits a condominium property regime on agricultural land from being amended to allow a residential dwelling. Prohibits the subdivision of agricultural land 25 acres or greater for the purpose of creating a condominium property regime. Prohibits any residential project created as a condominium under chapter 514B, HRS, or a planned community association under chapter 421J, HRS, in class A or B agricultural lands.	AEN, CPH



<u>SB 584</u> (SSCR29) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO MORTGAGES. Removes the requirement that a co-mortgagor assisting a qualified resident in securing a mortgage to purchase a dwelling unit from the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation be a family member. Requires a qualified resident who is assisted by a co-mortgager to have an income of at least fifty per cent of the amount required to qualify for a loan to purchase the dwelling unit.	HOU, CPH
<u>SB 1258</u> (SSCR239) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Establishes requirements for operating an autocycle. Defines autocycle.	TRE, CPH
<u>SB 1280, SD1</u> (SSCR306) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Establishes additional performance bond requirements for surety companies and bond companies under the Hawaii Public Procurement Code.	GVO, CPH
<u>SB 593</u> (SSCR40) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ANIMALS. Requires research facilities to make available for adoption healthy cats and dogs that are no longer needed for research. Authorizes research facilities to contract with local animal rescue organizations to facilitate the adoption of the cats and dogs.	AEN, CPH
SB 611, SD1 (SSCR443) Status & Testimony	<u>RELATING TO FIRE SPRINKLERS.</u> <u>Repeals the June 30, 2017, expiration date of Act 83, Session</u> <u>Laws of Hawaii 2012, which prohibits counties from requiring</u> <u>installation or retrofitting of automatic fire sprinklers in (1) new or</u> <u>existing detached one- or two-family dwelling units used only for</u> <u>residential purposes; and (2) non-residential agricultural and</u> <u>aquacultural structures located outside an urban area.</u>	PSM/HOU, CPH [Measure added on 2/22/2017]
