HB 50, HD3 (HSCR967) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO APPRAISAL MANAGEMENT COMPANIES. Establishes an Appraisal Management Company Registration Program within the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to conform to minimum standards of the Appraisal Management Companies Final Rule and Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act. Establishes registration requirements, standards, and penalties for violations. (HB50 HD3)	CPH, WAM
HB 239, HD2 (HSCR1061) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS. Clarifies that when a standard proxy form is returned with no proxy or voting boxes checked or more than one proxy or voting box checked, the proxy shall be counted for quorum purposes only. Exempts box requesting an annual audit report from determining validity of proxy. (HB239 HD2)	СРН
HB 1027, HD1 (HSCR750) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO NONPROFIT CORPORATIONS. Amends the nonprofit corporations law to impose a duty of loyalty on directors and officers of nonprofit corporations, recodify provisions that would allow nonprofit corporations to convert into and out of domestic nonprofit corporations, and give the Attorney General additional time to review proposed dissolutions of nonprofits. HB 917, HD1 (HSCR916) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO INSURANCE. Clarifies that a mutual benefit society shall maintain a minimum net worth calculated based on annual net premium revenues and net health care expenditures. Requires approval of reinsurer. (HB917 HD1)	СРН
HB 91, HD1 (HSCR1060) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO INSURANCE. Clarifies that acute care hospitals are covered under the clean claims statute, section 431:13-108, Hawaii Revised Statutes. (HB91 HD1)	СРН
HB 1262, HD2 (HSCR726) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO CHARTER TOUR OPERATORS. Permits charter tour operators to maintain client trust accounts in a federally insured financial institution outside the State; provided that charter tour operators agree to allow the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to access the tour operator's financial records through the financial institution. (HB1262 HD2)	СРН
HB 206, HD2 (HSCR840) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ENHANCED 911 SERVICES. Establishes a prepaid wireless E911 surcharge at the point of sale. Allows sellers to deduct and retain for administrative purposes 1.5% of the surcharge that is collected. Requires deposit of surcharge balance in the enhanced 911 fund. Requires a report. Sunsets on June 30, 2022. (HB206 HD2)	CPH, WAM



HB 1081, HD2 (HSCR751) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO CITATIONS FOR BEAUTY CULTURE VIOLATIONS. Authorizes the issuance of a citation for specific violations of beauty culture laws by licensees and permittees. Sets forth a process for licensees and permittees to contest the citation and provides for the assessment of fines for each violation. Establishes requirements for persons selling or demonstrating beauty products or techniques for promotional purposes to adhere to licensing requirements with certain exceptions. (HB1081 HD2)	CPH, JDL
HB 680, HD2 (HSCR1072) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE. Requires licensees under the Board of Barbering and Cosmetology to complete a one-time awareness education program on intimate partner violence awareness and education. Requires the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to adopt materials by the selected nonprofit intimate partner violence awareness education program. Provides that assaulting or threatening to cause bodily injury to a barber or beauty operator is a misdemeanor. (HB680 HD2)	CPH, JDL
HB 563, HD1 (HSCR883) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO DENTAL HYGIENISTS. Permits licensed dental hygienists in the State to operate under general, rather than direct, supervision of a licensed dentist in specified circumstances that protect patient health and safety. (HB563 HD1)	СРН
HB 235, HD1 (HSCR959) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HEALTH. Increases the authorized benefit for acupuncture treatments allowed under personal injury protection benefits provided through motor vehicle insurance. Caps total benefit amount for acupuncture, chiropractic, and naturopathic treatments. (HB235 HD1)	CPH, WAM
HB 552, HD1 (HSCR845) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE. Ensures that benefits of the Affordable Care Act are preserved under State law in the case of repeal of the ACA by Congress. Preserves the individual mandate, minimum essential benefit requirements, extended dependent coverage, and prohibitions on preexisting condition exclusions and gender discrimination in premiums and costs. Establishes a trust fund and procedures to reimburse insurers for unrecouped costs of providing minimal essential insurance benefits. (HB552 HD1)	CPH, WAM
