HB 1410, HD2 (HSCR1076) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES. Repeals the Emergency Medical Services Special Fund and appropriates an equal amount of general funds to the Department of Health for emergency medical services. Establishes a pilot program and authorizes TAT expenditure for county regulation and operation of ambulance services. Establishes and appropriates funds for a community paramedic pilot program.
