HB 475 Status	RELATING TO MOVIE THEATRES. Makes permanent the requirements that a public accommodation that owns, leases, leases to, or operates a motion picture theater in more than two locations in the State must under certain conditions provide open movie captioning, and audio description upon request of any motion picture that is produced and offered with audio description. HB 1042 Status	RELATING TO THE SMALL BUSINESS REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY ACT. Adopt a more explicit definition of "small business," clarify the powers of the Small Business Regulatory Review Board, increase the number of board members from nine to eleven, and clarify when reporting by the agencies is required for submission to the board and for submission by the board to the Legislature. <u>HB 599</u> <u>Proposed HD1</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE PLAN. Proposed HD1: Makes the goal of the State to provide housing to households with extremely low- to above moderate- income households. Makes a technical amendment to the state goals of the Hawaii State Planning Act	EDB, FIN
