HB 1108 Status RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS.

Limits the exemption from payment of parking meter fees to vehicles

that display a distinguishing parking permit or decal issued to an applicant who presents a certificate of disability that verifies that the applicant is licensed to drive a motor vehicle and cannot reach or

operate a parking meter because of a physical disability.

HB 1109 Status RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS.

Clarifies the authority of law enforcement officers or commissioned volunteer enforcement officers to confiscate disability parking permits

that are used unlawfully.

HB 1110 Status RELATING TO TIER II FILING FEES FOR REPORTING OF

HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES.

Changes the Hawaii Emergency Planning and Community Right-To-Know Act, Tier II filing fee from \$100 to \$200 to provide needed preparedness resources to Local Area Planning Committees.
