HLT, LAB, FIN Status Improves access for firefighters to comprehensive medical coverage and service-connected disability retirement benefits for hazardous duty related diseases that are presumed to arise out of and in the course of employment. HB 916 RELATING TO LOAN REPAYMENT FOR HEALTH CARE HLT, HED, FIN Status PROFESSIONALS. Makes an appropriation for the health care professionals loan repayment program administered through the John A. Burns School of Medicine. HB 467 RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING IN PUBLIC HLT, LAB, FIN EMPLOYMENT. Status Creates 7 separate collective bargaining units for employees of the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation. HB 468 RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING IN PUBLIC HLT, LAB, FIN Status EMPLOYMENT. Establishes collective bargaining unit (15) for employees with the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation. HB 469 RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS HLT, LAB, FIN CORPORATION. Status Authorizes the Hawaii health systems corporation to enter into a contract for the privatization of food services at Hawaii health systems corporation facilities.
