<u>SB 174, SD2</u> (<u>SSCR635</u>) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA. Amends the definition of debilitating medical condition to include lupus, epilepsy, multiple sclerosis, arthritis, and autism as conditions that qualify for the legal use of medical marijuana. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD2)	HLT, JUD
SB 305, SD1 (SSCR675) Status	RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA DISPENSARIES. Specifies that video monitoring and recording of medical marijuana production center and retail dispensing location premises shall be retained for a period of forty-five days. Takes effect on 1/7/2059. (SD1)	HLT, JUD
SB 786, SD1 (SSCR554) Status	RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA. Amends Hawaii Revised Statutes and Hawaii Administrative Rules to substitute references to "medical marijuana" and like terms with "medical cannabis" and like terms.
