HB 914 Status	RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE. Requires a health carrier with a network plan to maintain a network that is sufficient in numbers with appropriate types of providers to ensure that covered persons have access to covered services.	HLT, CPC, FIN
HB 248 Status	RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE. Requires all health insurers, including health benefits plans under chapter 87A, HRS, to disclose on their public web sites any standards, criteria, or information used for making preauthorization decisions.	HLT, CPC, FIN
HB 156 Status	RELATING TO REIMBURSEMENT OF PHARMACISTS. Requires insurers, mutual and fraternal benefit societies, and health maintenance organizations to recognize services provided by pharmacists.	HLT, CPC, FIN
HB 1406 Status	RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF PHARMACY. Amends the definition of "practice of pharmacy."	HLT, JUD

HB 676 Status	RELATING TO HEALTH. Authorizes pharmacists to prescribe and administer the human papillomavirus vaccine to persons between eleven and seventeen years of age. Specifies requirements pharmacists must meet prior to administering the human papillomavirus vaccine.	HLT, CPC
HB 1299	RELATING TO HEALTH.	HLT, JUD, FIN

Authorizes a pharmacy to provide a customized patient medication package to any patient of an institutional facility or any member of the

general public, subject to certain conditions.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
