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HB 93 Status	RELATING TO MEDICAID. Establishes an add-on payment of forty per cent to the medicaid base rate for medicaid enrollees at long-term care facilities that have medically complex conditions requiring higher level of care. Appropriates funds for fiscal years 2018 and 2019 to cover increased costs.	HUS/HLT, FIN
HB 527 Status	RELATING TO MOBILE CLINICS. Appropriates funds for establishing, staffing, and operating two mobile clinics to serve the homeless population.	HUS/HLT, FIN
<u>HB 556</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROCUREMENT. Requires applicants who submit contract proposals to operate a child care program to have necessary business licenses. Exempts applicants who submit proposals to operate a child care program or group living facility from having to obtain licenses to operate under section 346-161 and chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, prior to their proposal being accepted. HB 612 Status	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE AGING AND DISABILITY RESOURCE CENTER. Makes an appropriation for the aging and disability resource center.	HUS/HLT, FIN

HB 1195 Status	RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS. Appropriates funds to DOH and DHS, including the office of youth services, to provide homeless outreach services.	HUS/HLT, FIN

Specifies that coverage for telehealth under the State's medicaid managed care and fee-for-service programs includes psychiatric services provided through a coordinated care manager who is present in a primary health care provider's office through telehealth. HB 874 Status	RELATING TO HOUSING. Requires an unspecified percentage of funds in the mental health and substance abuse special fund to be used to provide homes for persons who qualify for Social Security disability benefits and are diagnosed with a life-long serious mental illness.	HUS/HLT, FIN
HB 1008 Status	RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH. Requires DHS and DOH to deem occupational therapists as qualified mental health care professionals.	HUS/HLT, IAC/CPC
