HB 50 Status

RELATING TO APPRAISAL MANAGEMENT COMPANIES.

IAC, CPC, FIN

Establishes an appraisal management company registration program within the department of commerce and consumer affairs to conform to minimum standards established under federal law and regulations. Establishes registration requirements, standards, and penalties for

violations. Takes effect on 1/1/2018.

HB 200 Status

RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS.

IAC, CPC, JUD

Broadens the scope of condominium related disputes for which an apartment owner or the board of directors can mandate mediation. Lowers the additional annual condominium education trust fund fee, used to support costs of mediation, to 75 cents times the number of condominiums units included in a registered project or association and discourages future surpluses of the fee. Specifies that any surplus funds collected for the additional annual condominium education trust fund to support mediation may be used for any education purpose provided under section 514B-71(a), HRS. Amends the conditions that mandate mediation and exceptions to mandatory mediation.

HB 206 Status

RELATING TO ENHANCED 911 SERVICES.

IAC, CPC, FIN

Establishes a prepaid wireless E911 surcharge at the point of sale. Allows sellers to deduct and retain for administrative purposes 3% of the surcharge that is collected. Requires the surcharge balance to be

deposited in the enhanced 911 fund.

HB 218 Status

RELATING TO FORECLOSURES.

IAC, CPC

Requires every public notice of a public sale of mortgaged property to

be published 3 times in a newspaper and on a state website.

HB 337 RELATING TO PUBLIC ACCOUNTANCY. IAC, CPC Status Makes a housekeeping amendment to broaden the standards that peer review reports under section 466-36, HRS, must be performed in accordance with. HB 404 RELATING TO BOATING. IAC, CPC, FIN Requires commercial thrill craft and parasailing operators to complete Status a water safety education course. Appropriates funds. HB 624 RELATING TO THE INSTALLATION OF INFRASTRUCTURE. IAC, CPC, FIN **Status** Clarifies the telecommunication exemptions to include small wireless facilities. Repeals and codifies in the Hawaii Revised Statutes provisions of Act 151, SLH 2011, that are permanent and general. Expands the definition of wireless communications antennas to include small wireless facilities.

HB 625 Status RELATING TO INFRASTRUCTURE.

IAC, WAL, CPC

Establishes the siting process of infrastructure for small wireless

facilities and small wireless facilities networks on state and county

owned land.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
