<u>SB 1277, SD1</u> (SSCR136) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO PUBLIC AGENCY MEETINGS. Allows the minutes at public agency meetings to be kept by written or recorded means.	GVO, JDL
<u>SB 332</u> (SSCR91) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO NOTARIES PUBLIC. Prohibits a commissioned notary public from accepting a limited purpose driver's license for verification of identification.	CPH, JDL
<u>SB 979</u> (SSCR140) <u>Status &</u> Testimony	RELATING TO DISCRIMINATORY PRACTICES IN PUBLIC ACCOMMODATIONS. Removes the requirement of a conspiracy of two or more persons as an element of prohibited discriminatory practices in places of public accommodation.	CPH, JDL
<u>SB 21, SD1</u> (SSCR33) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO CHILD CARE. Increases the monetary penalties and establishes criminal penalties for violating the laws relating child care facilities.	HMS/CPH, JDL
<u>SB 1036, SD1</u> (SSCR125) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO FIREARMS. Clarifies that failure to register a firearm within the required time period does not relieve the owner of the duty to register the firearm. Allows the owner of an unregistered firearm to register the firearm thereafter without penalty.	PSM, JDL
<u>SB 898, SD1</u> (SSCR167) <u>Status &</u> Testimony	RELATING TO FIREARMS OWNED, POSSESSED, OR CONTROLLED BY PERSONS WHO POSE A SERIOUS RISK OF VIOLENCE OR HARM TO PUBLIC SAFETY. Upon application allows law enforcement to seize and retain firearms or ammunition owned, possessed, or controlled by a person who poses a serious risk of violence or harm to public safety, pursuant to court order.	PSM, JDL
