<u>HB 601</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY. Makes an appropriation to establish driving while impaired courts in Kona and Hilo on Hawaii island.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 300</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SEARCH WARRANTS. Allows courts to authorize a person or entity other than an officer to provide technical assistance in executing a search warrant that pertains to an electronic device or storage media.	JUD
<u>HB 301</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO RESPONSE TO WRIT FOR CERTIORARI. Extends the time period for filing a response to an application for writ of certiorari with the supreme court from 15 days to 30 days.	JUD

<u>HB 367</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO APPROPRIATIONS TO THE OFFICE OF THE PROSECUTING ATTORNEY OF THE COUNTY OF HAWAII. Appropriates funds for the Big Island Juvenile Intake and Assessment Center of the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Hawaii.	JUD, FIN
HB 459 Status	RELATING TO FIREARMS. Requires law enforcement agencies to be notified of the identity of a firearms permit applicant whose application is denied because of firearm prohibitions established under federal or state law.	JUD
HB 477 Status	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE HAWAII COUNTY OFFICE OF THE PROSECUTING ATTORNEY. Makes an appropriation to the Office of the Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Hawaii for the Career Criminal Prosecution Unit, including the hiring of necessary staff.	JUD, FIN
HB 1022 Status	MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE, ITS OFFICERS, OR ITS EMPLOYEES. Makes appropriations for claims against the State, its officers, and its employees.	JUD, FIN
