<u>HB 442</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MINIMUM WAGE. Authorizes the counties to establish a higher minimum wage than the state minimum wage.	LAB, FIN
HB 1433 Status	RELATING TO MINIMUM WAGE. Requires DLIR to adjust the hourly minimum wage in accordance with the Honolulu region consumer price index.	LAB, FIN
<u>HB 5</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO LABOR. Annually increases minimum wage 1/1/18 - 1/1/2021. On 9/30/2021 and thereafter requires DLIR to adjust the minimum hourly wage in accordance with the Honolulu region consumer price index. Deletes tip credit.	LAB, FIN
HB 809 Status	RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT. Clarifies the grounds under which an employer may take employment action without committing a discriminatory practice. Takes effect on 1/1/2018.	LAB, JUD
HB 678 Status	RELATING TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE. Allows an employee to take family leave in addition to victim leave when the leave is related to domestic or sexual violence against the employee or the employee's minor child. Requires an employee to submit certification related to domestic or sexual violence of the employee or the employee's minor child. Requires employer confidentiality of information related to domestic or sexual violence against the employee or the employee's minor child.	LAB, FIN
HB 1371 Status	RELATING TO WORKPLACE VIOLENCE. Establishes department of labor and industrial relations responsibilities for incidents of workplace violence as well as investigation procedures for incidents of workplace violence.	LAB, JUD



HB 683 Status	RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT. Establishes a 6-week paid maternity and paternity leave policy for government employees to ensure that Hawaii's working families are adequately supported during times of needing to provide care to a newborn or bond with a new child.	LAB, FIN
HB 214 Status	RELATING TO PAID FAMILY LEAVE. Provides for four weeks of paid family leave for full-time State employees.	LAB, FIN
HB 213 Status	RELATING TO FAMILY LEAVE. Permits an employee to take family leave in order to care for the employee's sibling with a serious health condition or upon the death of an employee's child, spouse, reciprocal beneficiary, sibling, or parent. Specifies notice and certification requirements.	LAB, FIN
<u>HB 4</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Requires employers to provide a minimum amount of paid sick leave to employees to be used to care for themselves or a family member who is ill or needs medical care.	LAB, FIN
