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| <u>SB 363</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. Increases the fines for violations of use of mobile electronic devices while operating a motor vehicle. | TRE, WAM |
| <u>SB 364</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS. Increases the fine for failure to use a seat belt. | TRE, WAM |
| <u>SB 367</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. Increases the fines for violations associated with a person operating a vehicle after the person's license and privilege has been suspended or revoked for operating a vehicle under the influence of an intoxicant. | TRE, WAM |
| <u>SB 663</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. Increases the fines for speeding violations occurring in a school zone or construction area. | TRE, WAM |
| <u>SB 664</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. Increases fines for persons who commit the offense of driving a motor vehicle at an excessive speed. | TRE, WAM |
| <u>SB 217</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO VISION ZERO. Requires DOT to implement a vision zero program in Hawaii by July 1, 2018. | TRE, WAM |
| <u>SB 659</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u> | RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. Increases the fines for violations of operating a vehicle while under the influence of an intoxicant. | TRE, WAM |
