HB 530, HD2, SD1 (SSCR945) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HOMEBUYER ASSISTANCE. Updates the Downpayment Loan Program under the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation. Effective 7/1/2030. (SD1)	HOU, WAM
HB 1396, HD2, SD1 (SSCR1017) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO COMMUNITY CARE FOSTER FAMILY HOMES. Authorizes the Department of Health, working in consultation with the Department of Human Services, to allow two private- pay individuals to be cared for in the same community care foster family home if certain requirements are met. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1)	HMS/CPH, WAM
HB 1272, HD1, SD1 (SSCR1015) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO IMPROVING ACCESS TO PSYCHIATRIC CARE FOR MEDICAID PATIENTS. Specifies that coverage for telehealth under the State's medicaid managed care and fee-for-service programs includes psychiatric services delivered via telehealth through a behavioral health care manager who is present in a primary health care provider's office. Takes effect 7/1/2075. (SD1)	HMS/CPH, WAM
HB 90, HD1, SD1 (SSCR1018) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE NURSING FACILITY SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM. Extends the Nursing Facility Sustainability Program for two years. Appropriates funds out of the Nursing Facility Sustainability Program Special Fund for fiscal year 2017-2018 and fiscal year 2018-2019. Takes effect 6/29/2075. (SD1)	HMS/CPH, WAM
HB 89, HD1 (SSCR1020) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE HOSPITAL SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM. Continues the Hospital Sustainability Program for two years. Appropriates funds out of the Hospital Sustainability Program Special Fund for Fiscal Years 2017-2018 and 2018-2019. (HB89 HD1)	HMS/CPH, WAM



HB 918, HD1, SD1 (SSCR964) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO EARLY INTERVENTION. Appropriates funds for the procurement and maintenance of and training for a web-based data system in the Department of Health's Early Intervention Section. Effective 7/1/2090. (SD1)	CPH, WAM
HB 1410, HD2, SD1 (SSCR972) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES. Repeals the Emergency Medical Services Special Fund and appropriates an equal amount of general funds to the Department of Health for emergency medical services. Appropriates funds for community paramedic services. Effective 7/1/2090. (SD1)	CPH, WAM
HB 1246, HD2, SD1 (SSCR958) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO ALTERNATIVES TO INCARCERATION. Authorizes electronic monitoring and surveillance of offenders, separate from curfew, in programs that offer alternatives to incarceration. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1)	PSM, WAM
HB 110, HD1, SD1 (SSCR935) Status & Testimony	MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS. Makes an appropriation for the public employment cost items and cost adjustments for employees of the various legislative agencies who are excluded from collective bargaining. Takes effect 1/7/2059. (SD1)	JDL, WAM
HB 1182, HD1, SD1 (SSCR976) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. Requires the ERS actuary to conduct annual stress tests of the system. Directs the ERS board to submit annual reports of the tests to the legislature. Takes effect 1/7/2059. (SD1)	JDL, WAM
HB 810, HD1, SD1 (SSCR938) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING. Allows collective bargaining parties to resolve impasses related to contribution disputes through binding arbitration. Takes effect 1/7/2059. (SD1)	JDL, WAM
HB 1114, HD1, SD1 (SSCR975) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH PENALTIES. Amends fines for Hawaii Occupational Safety and Health violations and requires the Director of Labor and Industrial Relations to adjust the penalties each year pursuant to federal law. Requires the Director of Labor and Industrial Relations to report to the Legislature each year. Takes effect on 7/1/2050. (SD1)	JDL, WAM
HB 235, HD1, SD1 (SSCR932) Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HEALTH. Specifies that the authorized benefit for acupuncture treatments allowed under personal injury protection benefits provided through motor vehicle insurance shall be capped at thirty visits and tied to the charges, and any subsequent increases in charges, permissible under the workers' compensation supplemental medical fee schedule. Clarifies that the combined total of naturopathic and chiropractic treatments allowed under personal injury protection benefits provided through motor vehicle insurance may not exceed thirty visits. Effective 7/1/2112. (SD1)	CPH, WAM
